

filing objections to the Application has expired, and no objection to the Application was filed with this Court. Accordingly, it is **ORDERED** that:

1. The Application is **APPROVED** to the extent set forth in this order.
2. The Receiver's fees incurred during the Application Period are approved on an interim basis and allowed in the amount of \$119,297.25.
3. Dykema's fees incurred during the Application Period are approved on an interim basis and allowed in the amount of \$143,353.60.
4. Romero's fees incurred during the Application Period are approved on an interim basis and allowed in the amount of \$1,912.50.
5. Jones's fees incurred during the Application Period are approved on an interim basis and allowed in the amount of \$56,290.00.
6. Ahuja's fees incurred during the Application Period are approved on an interim basis and allowed in the amount of \$292,269.00.
7. Palmour's fees incurred during the Application Period are approved on an interim basis and allowed in the amount of \$19,675.00.
8. The Receiver's expenses incurred during the Application Period are approved on an interim basis and allowed in the amount of \$63.60.
9. Dykema's expenses incurred during the Application Period in connection with services rendered on behalf of the Receiver are approved on an interim basis and allowed in the amount of \$18,456.58.
10. BDO's expenses incurred during the Application Period in connection with services rendered on behalf of the Receiver are approved on an interim basis and allowed in the amount of \$5,670.06.

11. Ahuja's expenses incurred during the Application Period in connection with services rendered on behalf of the Receiver are approved on an interim basis and allowed in the amount of \$117.60.
12. The Receiver is hereby authorized to pay all outstanding fee and expense amounts approved in this order for the Application Period to Dykema (inclusive of the Receiver), Romero, Jones, BDO, Ahuja, and Palmour from the available funds of the Receivership Estates.
