QUESTION 2:

I can make electricity by day and by night. I am tall, streamlined and aerodynamic. I am called a WT. What is a WT?

ANSWER: I am a wind turbine.

QUESTION 3:

I use heat from deep underground to boil water, to make steam which is used to make electricity. I am called GT energy. G stands for a word which means the study of rocks and T is a word meaning 'hot'. What am I?

ANSWER: I am Geothermal energy.
