Ask as many questions as possible.

Important Questions to Ask

When was your last meal?

Are you single or married?

Do you have children?

Have you applied for county assistance?

Have you been treated by a Doctor for any mental illnesses?

Do you struggle from or have you ever struggled with alcohol or substance abuse?

Do you have any family that would be willing to help? Can we contact them?

Do you have a place to stay tonight? How long can you stay there?

Do you have an income?

Do you have any felonies?

If they have children: Ask "Have you applied for the one-time homeless assistance through the County of Riverside?" (See pages 6 & 7 for program details.)

Project T.O.U.C.H Current Programs:

- **Shared and Homeless Prevention Housing** with 215 beds in two fourplexes, 14 apartments and nine homes to assist families, single mothers, single men and women, averaging 190 to 210 daily including 55 to 60 children.
- Local Winter Emergency Shelter provides overnight shelter for approximately four months per year to meet the needs of hundreds of clients each winter. Dinner and Breakfast is served 7 days per week while the shelter is open.
- **Police Response Program:** Responding 24/7 to calls from the local police departments to assist in homeless situations.
- **Direct Emergency Assistance** for motel stays, food, gasoline, clothing, bus tickets and any other emergency needs.
- Community Food Program utilizes our long standing business
 relationships and new partnerships to provide a stream of food donations
 that not only feeds our clients in transitional housing, but also supports
 other local non-profit partners and churches that assist the community.
- Resource Referral Center responds to hundreds of calls monthly to
 provide appropriate resources to assist in any given situation. Project
 T.O.U.C.H partners with Social Services, Drug and Alcohol Rehab
 programs, Mental Health Services, Homeless Prevention Programs, and
 other community outreach programs.
- Work Training Program through our Divine Discount & Thrift Store. In this retail environment, clients are able to learn new skills, fulfill their required community service, work on responsibilities and commitment.

One Time Homeless Assistance

The County of Riverside offers to those who qualify, (they must have dependents and be eligible for cash aid) a Homeless Assistance program which provides a voucher for up to 16 days at a local hotel/motel in their area. The county will also issue a voucher for permanent housing which will cover last month and Security Deposit up to 80% of their cash aid. They must not have anywhere else to go, or any other resources in order to qualify for the voucher*.
