WHY WARRIORS?

This discipleship program transforms believers into warriors for our King Jesus Christ (Zech 10:3). **Warriors** are those who overcome through Christ because He has trained them for battles. (Ps 144:1)

Biblically, believers are also warriors with battles to fight. We are taught to fight the good fight of faith, while wearing the armor of God, resisting our own flesh, and also being mindful to follow the Lord and His ways into and out of every battle.

As believers, we will experience these battles and times of warfare from one of three levels: Our Personal Choices, from the World, and demonic forces. **In this program, you will learn how to gain victory on level one - your flesh. As we progress throughout the year, we'll introduce the concept of the world and demonic mental attacks. This program will also provide insight into any demonic resistance that you are facing.**

I. FLESH

Galatians 5:16 - But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.

Galatians 5:19-21 - Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

1 Corinthians 10:13 - No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide a way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.

2. THE WORLD

Cosmos most often refers to the inhabited earth and the people who live on the earth, which functions apart from God. Satan is the ruler of this "cosmos" (John 12:31; 16:11; 1 John 5:19). By the simple definition that the word world refers to a world system ruled by Satan, we can more readily appreciate Christ's claims that believers are no longer of the world—we are no longer ruled by sin, nor are we bound by the principles of the world.

3. DEMONIC

James 4:7 - So humble yourselves before God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

1 John 4:4 - Little children, you are from God and have overcome them, for he who is in you is greater than he who is in the world.

Ephesians 6:12 - For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places.

“And this rock will be the bedrock foundation on which I will build my church (Ekklesia)—my legislative assembly and the power of death will not be able to overpower it! HERE ARE THE FIVE CONCEPTS OF HIS KINGDOM REVEALED IN THE BIBLE THAT SERVE AS A FOUNDATION OF BELIEF FOR THIS PROGRAM.

1. **Jesus is our King** - He is the ultimate source of authority in the kingdom and through His authority establishes the kingdom. Jesus is our eternal King, impacting our world and lives with His will, purposes, and intentions.

Gideon Case Study

DISCIPLINE OF PRAYER

Praying is not merely some psychological exercise or discipline. It is not like a form of meditation where we engage in it strictly for our benefit and edification. It is a genuine conversation. You speak, and God listens. He will speak back to you through His Word (the Bible), through circumstances, or directly to you (in a still small voice). Prayer trains us to walk by our spirits and to crucify our flesh.

Psalm 65:2 O You who hear prayer, To You all men come.

Psalm 145:18-19 The Lord is near to all who call upon Him, To all who call upon Him in truth. He will fulfill the desire of those who fear Him; He will also hear their cry and will save them.

What is the biblical definition of prayer?

The essence of prayer is simply talking to God as you would to a beloved friend—without pretense or flippancy. Talking includes speaking and listening, even to God. Yet it is in that very attitude toward prayer that so many believers have trouble.

Key components of prayer often include:

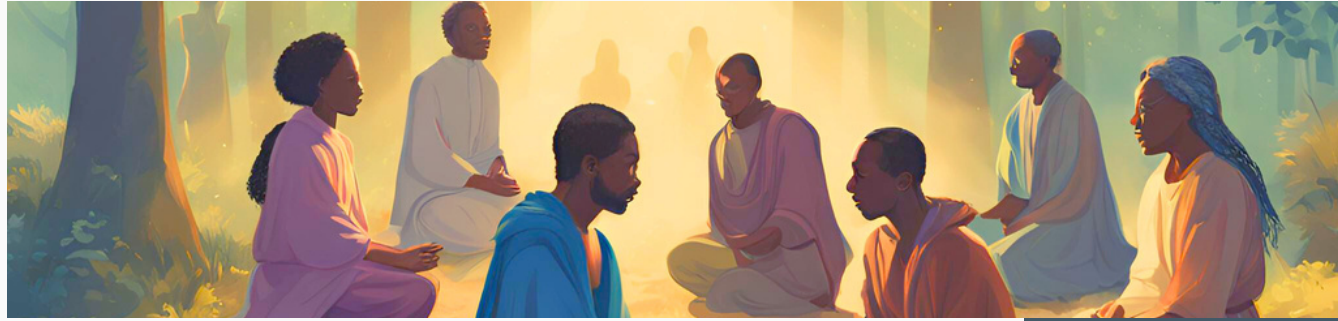
1. Adoration: Expressing love, praise, and worship for the divine.
2. Confession: Acknowledging and seeking forgiveness for one's shortcomings or sins.
3. Thanksgiving: Gratitude for blessings, provisions, and the goodness of the divine.
4. Supplication: Making requests or asking for divine intervention, guidance, or help for oneself or others.

Jesus gave us an example or guide in Matthew 6:9-13:

Pray then like this: “Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.”

No spiritual exercise is such a blending of complexity and simplicity. It is the simplest form of speech that an infant's lips can try. It is as appropriate to the Bible scholar as to the little child. One can pray about anything one wants to, any time, any place.

Your charge this month is to spend more time in prayer, at least 30 to 60 minutes, daily. Remember to jot down in your journal your memorable experiences with God.



Spirit-led Prayer

In WTS, you will have the opportunity to receive prayer. In these prayer sessions, you'll be prayed for using a combination of the following Holy Spirit, walking in the gift of love, the gift of prophecy, the gift of knowledge, and the gift of discerning of spirits. It's not for the convicting, exposing of sins, warning, or even the counseling of people.

These prayers can be life-changing because they can provide strategic insight into your unique situations, personal Words from the Lord, and/or deliverance from persistent problems. One word from the Lord is life-changing.

“But [on the other hand] the one who prophesies speaks to people for edification [to promote their spiritual growth] and [speaks words of encouragement] [to uphold and advise them concerning the matters of God] and [speaks words of] consolation [to compassionately comfort them].” 1 Cor. 14:3–5 AMP

Tips for Spirit-led Prayer Sessions:

- Listen to the Holy Spirit within you and the Spirit of the Lord using others. Listen as they speak and pay attention to His promptings externally and internally. The Lord loves to work through unity.
- Yield your agendas, thoughts, past experiences, and concerns before you pray for others. It's not about us or what He did yesterday. It's about our humble posture of availability for His glory. So we yield. Then we pay attention to what He's saying and doing now. While yielding, capture every thought, feeling, vision, picture, and impression that you experience in order to share, in time. Sharing should be done in decency and order.
- When prompted by the Spirit to share, share what you received even before you understand. The gift of prophecy, as with the other gifts, works by love and faith. So step out in faith in God, give what you've received only, and then trust God to bubble up the rest from you (or another).

Apostleship & Prophecy Gifts Highlights*

Gift of Apostleship

Jesus gave some to be apostles, prophets, evangelists, shepherds, and teachers at His ascension (Ephesians 4:7–12). New Testament apostles represent a distinct category of apostles. They do not have the authority to write Scripture as the original Apostles did. They also have a different purpose in the sense of establishing the church – the foundation has already been set.

The mission for those with the gift of apostleship today is to connect others, build new things, plant new ministries and churches, go into places where the Gospel is not preached, reach across cultures to establish churches in challenging environments, raise and develop leaders, call out and lead pastors and shepherds, launch new ministries, and much more. They often have many different gifts that allow them to fulfill their ministry. These are leaders of leaders and ministers of ministers. They are influencers and entrepreneurs. They are typically entrepreneurial and can take risks and perform difficult tasks. Missionaries, church planters, certain Christian scholars and institutional leaders, and those leading multiple ministries or churches often have the gift of apostleship. See also Ephesians 4:11, 1 Corinthians 12:28, Acts 1:21–22, 1 Corinthians 9:1.

Gift of Prophecy

The Greek word for the gift of prophecy is propheteia, which is the ability to receive a divinely inspired message and deliver it to others in the church. These messages can take the form of exhortation, correction, disclosure of secret sins, prediction of future events, comfort, inspiration, or other revelations given to equip and edify the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 14:3–4, 24–25). The gift of prophecy is not the same as a person in the office of the prophet. Please read the following scriptures: Judges 4, Luke 2:21–39, Eph. 4, Acts 21:8–9, and your She book reading for this month. The gift of prophecy does not constitute the authoritative Word of God; as such, it must be tested against the Scriptures (1 Thessalonians 5:20–21).

The Holy Spirit gives the gift of prophecy to some believers to make God's heart known and to edify the church. This gift is for the benefit of both believers and unbelievers and is a sign that God is truly among His church (1 Corinthians 14:22–25). Those with this gift are sensitive to both the prompting of the Holy Spirit and the needs of the church body. They should be humble and continually study the Scriptures to test these revelations before speaking them. When they do speak, they should allow and even expect others to weigh what is said against the Scriptures and interpret the message accordingly. In this way, the church may be continually built up together in unity (1 Corinthians 14:4, 26). (See also Romans 12:6; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 14:1–5; Ephesians 4:11–12; 1 Peter 4:10–11.)

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WHAT IS A SERVANT LEADER?

According to Jesus, our example of leadership, under the authority of our Father in Heaven, the servant-leader is servant-first.

In our time, author Robert K. Greenleaf said, “That person is sharply different from one who is leader first, perhaps because of the need to assuage an unusual power drive or to acquire material possessions. The leader-first and the servant-first are two extreme types. Between them, some shadings and blends are part of the infinite variety of human nature.

The difference manifests itself in the care taken by the servant-first to make sure that other people’s highest priority needs are being served.

The best test, and difficult to administer, is: Do those served grow as persons? Do they, while being served, become healthier, wiser, freer, more autonomous, and more likely to become servants? And, what is the effect on the least privileged in society? Will they benefit or at least not be further deprived?”

A servant-leader focuses primarily on the growth and well-being of people and the communities to which they belong. While traditional leadership generally involves the accumulation and exercise of power by one at the top of the pyramid, servant leadership is different. Our biblical example of servant-leader shares power puts the needs of others first, and helps people develop and perform as highly as possible.

In this program, you will learn how to lead as a servant leader. You will overcome the leadership styles from the world, and learn the power of influence given through serving others well, utilizing your gifts and strengths, all while increasing in favor with God and man.

JESUS - SERVANT LEADER

“Now it was just before the feast of Passover. Yeshua knew that His hour had come to depart from this world to the Father. Having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them until the end. While the seder meal was happening, the devil had already put in the heart of Judah from Kriot that he should hand over Yeshua. Yeshua knew that the Father had given all things into His hands and that He had come from God and was returning to God. So He gets up from the meal and lays aside His outer garment, and taking a towel, He wrapped it around His waist. Then He pours water into a basin. He began to wash the disciples’ feet, drying them with the towel wrapped around Him.

Then He comes to Simon Peter, who says to Him, “Master, are You going to wash my feet?” Yeshua responded, “You don’t know what I am doing now, but you will understand after these things.” Peter said to Him, “You shall never wash my feet!” Yeshua answered him, “If I don’t wash you, you have no part with Me.” Simon Peter said to Him, “Master, then not only my feet but also my hands and my head!” Yeshua said to him, “He who has bathed has no need to wash, except the feet; he is completely clean. And you all are clean, though not everyone.” He knew who was betraying Him; for this reason, He said, “Not all of you are clean.”

So after He had washed their feet and put His robe back on and reclined again, He said to them, “Do you understand what I have done for you? You call Me ‘Teacher’ and ‘Master’—and rightly you say, for I am. So if I, your Master and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash each other’s feet. I have given you an example—you should do for each other what I have done for you. “Amen, amen I tell you, a servant isn’t greater than his master, and the one who is sent isn’t greater than the one who sent him. If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them!” John 13:1-17 (Tree of Life Version)

This simple act of washing feet is a metaphor for how leadership looks through the lens of Jesus’ grace. He modeled servant leadership for his disciples and taught them to do the same.

WHAT IS DISCIPLING CULTURE?

The term "disciple" has its roots in religious and philosophical contexts, and its meaning can vary depending on the context in which it is used. For believers and followers of Jesus Christ, a disciple is a student who is disciplined in His ways and Word. It involves learning and adopting the teachings and practices of the leader, with the goal of spiritual growth and spreading those teachings to others.

“Culture” refers to the shared beliefs, values, customs, behaviors, and artifacts that characterize a group or society. It encompasses the way people think, the norms they follow, the traditions they uphold, and the practices they engage in. Culture is a complex and multifaceted concept that impacts every aspect of human life, including the Kingdom of God.

The "Kingdom of God" is a central theme in the Bible, particularly in the teachings of Jesus Christ. It is often described as both a present reality and a future hope. While it's not explicitly defined in terms of a specific culture, the Bible provides insights into the values, principles, and characteristics associated with the Kingdom of God. (See Matthew 6:33; Luke 17:20-21, 1 Corinthians 15:50, Revelation 11:15-18)

For this program, we will compare the culture of the Kingdom of God against the culture of the world, to bring His Kingdom into our areas of influence. To disciple culture is to impact or influence the way people think, act, and relate to one another through divine revelation, love, prayers, and good works. It involves strategically shaping the beliefs, values, behaviors, and norms within a family, group, community, or society.
