Severe drought conditions with no relief in sight

A simple spark in the current dry conditions can result in an uncontrollable brush fire that threatens the lives of both people and animals. There have been many fires over the recent weeks and the loss has been massive. We are seeing levels of drought not seen this time of year in the past 128 years.

Here are some tips to help you do your part to prevent fires:

- Heed the burn ban do not have open fires!
- Reduce brush, trees and other flammable materials away from your home.
- Keep vehicles off dry grass. Exhaust systems can heat up to 1,000 degrees and ignite adjacent grasses and shrubs.
- Notify PEC when dead trees or overhanging limbs endanger the electrical lines.
