



**The Word of God Cuts to The Chase  
Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R.**

**October 10, 2021 – 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time  
Wisdom 7:7-11 & Mark 10:17-27 with Hebrew 4:12-13**

I believe the Word of God is living and effective. I hope the Word of God is sharper than any two-edged sword. I love that the Word of God discerns the reflections and the thoughts of the heart. Why? Because Jesus chose me to follow Him all the way!

There is a message from the Hebrew Scriptures and the Christian Scriptures. The message is so clear so many people have been seeking to confuse its meaning. Why? Because it is not the way the world, the flesh and the devil work!

The right way to act is to know wisdom is not found in what we own, in our health we have right now, in the light of truth that we possess. The right way is the way Jesus offered to the man wanting to know what to do to inherit eternal life – follow Jesus!

I've worked in public schools for 48 years. You'd think I'd graduate by now! I'm there to have an in-depth understanding of what is taught as wisdom. To get a job, make money, have the "good life" and be happy.

What do we have to say? What are we to do? "Go, sell what you have and give it to the poor and follow Me." For real? You would think by now with COVID, the loss of jobs and health, that more people would be asking, "What's deeper than having?"

To be chosen to know the Word of God is a call to profound humility out of which comes a prudent way of acting. The Word of God does change when people who have walk away. The Word of God is joy-filled and looking to give God the Glory!

His home town rejected Him. He kept on going. He had nowhere to lay His Head. He kept on going. He was not popular among the leaders. He kept on going. He was not esteemed. He kept on going. He didn't do what He wanted. He keeps on going!

Church, we are chosen to be sent to bring the Joy of the Gospel to people wounded by those who have the prestige and power. We are chosen to go to those not here given the energy of the Eucharist.
