Seekers Need To Look Up to Find the Vision! 4th Sunday – Zeph.2:3-3:12-13 & Matt 5:1-12 with 1Cor.1:26-31 – January 29, 2023 By Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. – Priest in Solidum

This is the first of five mountain top moments in Matthew's Gospel. This could be called Jesus' inaugural address. Some may call it Jesus' sharing His vision, so different from the vision of fallen human nature.

In fact, the very way to be excellent according to the world is exactly the opposite to the way the Father sent Jesus to reveal. As St. Paul explains, God chooses the fools to confound the wise, the weak to shame the strong. God's wisdom is so different.

Jesus moves not just away from the crowd. This time He moves up the mountain. He is taking His disciples with Him. Once He arrives at the top, He sits down to teach. He asks those who followed Him to look down and see the crowd in the valley.

Then Jesus shares what He sees. We can almost hear Jesus saying, "Look. Do you see the poor in Spirit down in the valley? I see you as the ones who will bring the kingdom of God to them."

Follow each of the eight ways to happiness. We can "feel" the momentum of the vision of Jesus being unfolded. The disciples are sent to give to those who are in the valley what they are seeking to find.

The final teaching is not what would be the conclusion of the world. The blessing that Jesus promises to His disciples, "Blessed are you when they insult you, persecute you and speak all kinds of evil against you in my name ... your reward will be great!"

Just what Zephaniah predicted will happen. The followers of the Way will be the humiliated and lowly remnant. Just the opposite of the world in which we live. We are chosen in just the same way. Why? Because grace and grace alone makes it all work.

When I listen to us, the followers of Jesus centered here in Eucharist, I hear beneath what we say, that we don't see ourselves as wise and strong. I believe we are right as the world would judge. But what Jesus can do through us! We can evangelize, form, and administer. We can do our mission to renew the earth. How? His grace!
