Power of God – Stumbling Block and Foolish – is Wise and Strong March 3, 2024 - Ex.20:1-17 & Jn.2:13-25 with 1 Cor.1:22-25 – 3rd Sunday of Lent By Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. – Priest in Solidum

The country is politically divided. The world has major conflicts. The struggle between "haves" and "have nots" is rising. This is a way to see our human condition. In the midst of this, March Madness in basketball and the Super Tuesday is to happen.

What is the message from the Word of Life? Respect the Creator. Stop false ways – the idol worshipping that is absorbing our media and our money. Moses and Jesus give the same message – Moses from the mountain top - Jesus in the temple.

Today would be no different than 3,200 years ago as Moses was leading his people out of slavery. Nor was it any different 2,100 years ago as Jesus was turning the world of the Jewish leaders up-side-down.

The power of God is a stumbling block to believers who want it both ways. We know the message is calling us to be signs of contradiction in our community. It is seen as foolish in public life. Given this constant tension, what does Paul encourage?

Do more than keep the commandments that Moses gave. Keep putting God in the center of all we do in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Jesus was seen as weak in His death. Jesus was judged a fool as He was put in the grave.

We are halfway between Ash Wednesday and Holy Thursday. Are we taking time to reflect and listen to the Word of Life? Are we finding ourselves practicing the way Jesus sees, speaks, and acts? Continue to go deeper into His way to wake us up.


