To Take The Long View Keeps All In Perspective Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. March 28, 2021 - Palm Sunday Isaiah 50:4-7 and Mark 14:1-15:47 with Philippians 2:6-11

We will hear familiar teaching this week. They deserve repeating to deepen our awareness. There is something about "ole time religion" that so often seems "right on time." Two come to mind – "nothing will take away our joy" and "Remember Me."

The first readings this week are from Isaiah, four Suffering Servant prophecies. The Gospel will be proclaimed twice. It is the actual living of the predictions of the saga of redemptive love. I invite us to take the long view and to put our lives in perspective.

"A well trained tongue" and the clear directions given for the Last Supper tells us Jesus is well aware of the world's way to control life. He wants us to be aware so we are not taken by surprise. Suffering and death is our fallen way. Jesus understands.

"Open my ear" and pray to listen attentively. Jesus shows us how to listen in the Garden, so different from Adam. He feels the fallen nature of his body. He turns His attention to His Father. He sweats drops of blood, ready for the fight with evil to the end.

"Have not rebelled" and the way of the cross is finished. No one will stop Jesus from forgiving. This grace is the redemptive energy of our Tremendous Lover. He has His eyes on the prize of the Resurrection and He wants us to remember – Let's Do It!!

"Lord is my help" and "Truly You are the Son of God" – the Roman Soldier knew. Mary received her Son in her lap. She felt the sorrow and the loss. It didn't have to be this way, if only we would have obeyed. But the end is not the end – let's wait.

Paul will show what community makes possible in his teaching of Jesus emptying Himself. Paul wants to do the same - to empty ourselves for the sake of those to whom we are sent. Keep perspective – in the end we will rise and give God the Glory.

We are chosen to know Jesus in the Breaking of the Bread and in the opening of the Scriptures. We know tested joy by suffering, hope by despair, love by fear, faith by doubt. I pray this week called Holy deepens us to listen and to speak what we hear; to finish what He sends us to do. For Jesus – You are truly the Son of God – We Remembered!
