We Shall Be Like Him – The Good Shepherd! Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. April 25, 2021 - 4th Sunday of Easter Acts 4:8-12 and John 10:11-18 with 1 John 3:1-2

I would never have discovered the truth that we, the children of God, will be like Jesus, the Good Shepherd, if it wasn't for St. John's letter! Would you? That we are to be the Good Shepherds to lay down our lives for those we lead – is St. John serious?

The message in the Word of God centers on our freely responding to the decision Jesus made by choosing us to be saved and sent – baptized and confirmed. Peter freely gives to the cripple the healing gift entrusted to him. The shepherd freely does so as well.

I find most people want to identify with the sheep. We want Jesus to be our Good Shepherd Who lays down His life for us and takes it up again. We have this perception that we want to cling to, especially when we sing Psalm 23 at a Home Going Liturgy.

What would happen if we listened to the words we hear every time we receive Holy Communion? What difference would it make if we were to hear "Behold the Lamb of God" and stopped there and looked at the Bread of Life?

We do not receive the Shepherd. We are receiving the Sheep led to slaughter. We were baptized and became His sheep. When we are confirmed we become His Shepherds – sent both to those who belong and to those who do not belong.

The Body of Christ I hold up for you to receive, the Body I hold up for myself to receive, I am asked to be sent to His children in Jesus' name. We are sent ¬as Christ's Ambassadors of Reconciliation. We are sent to forgive and invite those we love to forgive.

Fallen human nature is blind to this way of seeing. Jesus was sent to bring this vision into the hearts of sinful people like you and me. He was rejected for forgiving. The builders said life cannot survive by forgiving. But it is the cornerstone of our Church!

The alternative way of seeing and living is violence – either actual or potential. The fear of death too often is used to control life. You and I are chosen to do what St. Peter did. To heal the hurting – to forgive and encourage others to forgive. It takes common sense to protect the innocent. But it takes spiritual sense to forgive the guilty. Will we?
