

Common Ground Takes Practice – Take Small Steps

The common good is the unspoken goal of the Word of Life. This truth is so clearly expressed by Ezekiel and Matthew. It is not just a desire to live together but to encourage all of us to be our best selves. Do you hear the call to go beyond being kind?

There doesn't seem to be a need to be politically correct. What seems to be called for is to want each person to know each other enough to want what's best for all to be our best. In fact, I get a sense Jesus wants us to be part of a movement of love.

In both readings we are called to correct. Who are we called to correct? Who is the wicked person in Ezekiel? In the Gospel, Jesus speaks of your brother and sister who sins against you. For sure Jesus is speaking there of people we know.

Paul shares what we owe our brother or sister is to go beyond the violence of killing, stealing, hording, misusing those close to us. We are to love each other as we love ourselves. And loving calls for correcting at times.


I hear Jesus breaking the message down. He says to start one-on-one, to keep the process close enough that we can be in control over who else could hear about the wrongdoing. Let the one doing wrong push the envelope.

Can you remember a time you corrected? I remember a time I went to the store to buy some food. I came home and gave my dad the change. He asked me, "Did you give me all the money?" I said "Yes." He saw me chewing bubble gum.

He counted the money and there were a few cents missing. I swallowed the gum. His look was the lesson I learned – not to steal and not to lie. He didn't make a big deal out of it. He only said, "John, you can do better than that."

The example is simple. The impact was profound. The lesson learned has encouraged me to call people to better behavior. To want each of us to live our values, share our talents, give good example, and invite others to do the same.

Start with small encouraging corrections. When major issues arise, be ready!
