

He Looks For What We Produce

27th Sunday – Is.5:1-7 & Mt.21:33-44 with Ph.4:6-9 – October 8, 2023 By Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. – Priest in Solidum

The vineyard is the focus of the message in the Word today. We hear the owner does all the work up to the planting of the seeds for grapes. Keep in mind that grapes are the symbol for joy. The spiritual result of the blooming will produce joy.

Did you hear what happened? The violence that came. In Isaiah nothing came from the work. There wasn't the caring needed to bring grapes. In Matthew the grapes came. But the tenants didn't want the order to have them.

As Matthew walked through the process of denying the landowner access to the fruit, the tenants mistreated, beat, and stoned his servants. When the owner sent his son, he thought they would respect him. Him they killed, rejecting His Son.

What's the message to us in northwest Detroit? When we look at what we are doing with our talents and where we are spending our time, are we ensuring we are producing fruit – bringing to God what are the results of what God has given us?

St. Paul calls us out of our anxiety by asking us to pray to God for what we need. We then are to share the truth, be honorable and just in our relationships; pure and loving in our behavior, being gracious no matter what. Keep on doing it

With such an attitude as Confirmed, let's keep working to do our best in the face of discouragement and opposition. The One Who chose us, will give us what we need to produce the results that are possible. As we do God's will, we face into challenges.

In our daily lives attract people by your way of sharing with them, as St. Paul shares what he means. Invite to join us. Then as belonging to our community, let's look at what we are doing to move us farther along in our mission, ministry, and stewardship.

We are called to do what we can and see the fruit of our work as our gift to God. What comes from what we do is meant to be for the honor and glory of God. As we go forward with our lives personally and an as parish, let's keep looking to the One Who chose us. And let's come to work together to give the praise to Jesus through Mary.


