

To Stay In the Banquet There Is A Challenge For Us His Followers 28th Sunday – Is.25:6-10 & Mt.22:1-14 with Phil.4:12-20 – October 15, 2023 By Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. – Priest in Solidum

The Lord of the mountain from the Hebrew Scriptures is the King who wants to celebrate His Son's Wedding. These two readings give us an insight into the growth of the chosen to understand the One Who chose them.

Before Jesus, the narrative of the Word was to respond with violence. With Jesus the narrative changed to "putting on the wedding garment." Violence would not be the way to respond to violence. Jesus' wedding was with those who were redeemed.

Today to breathe this message when violence touches those we love is very much a challenge. It is so natural to throw off the wedding garment, our confirmation commitment – the Christian way to respond to sin – and to conform to the world's way.

We are on hard times. We hear of violence so much so that we may be numb to it. Some may ask "Why has it gone this far"? But to this question I ask, "Are we ready to be a sign of contradiction? Are we ready to respond as Pope Francis calls us to do?"

When people are violent, they know not what they are doing. Forgiving is the only response that gets to the cause of violence. Forgiving is the way out of death to life. When the Amish faced the death of their children, what a witness they gave. To breathe forgiving those who violent others, including those we love, is the "wedding garment."

When the king sent his only son, he assumed they would respect his son. To respond and not to react is quite a challenge. But that is the message of Jesus that His death was needed to show what He means.

He will turn our loss into our gain. We can hear this in St. Paul. He learnt to live with a little or with a lot. He was willing to go without as well as have what he needed. It calls for a profound faith to walk this way.

In our everyday lives such a radical decision may never happen. We may never face the challenge of the country of Jesus' birth. But we have our challenges to face that call for such a response ... to breathe forgiving and keep our wedding garment on
