The value of family has been seen historically as the foundation of society. O The development of each one of us is so impacted by our family. Parental authority is still honored by civil law respecting their right and responsibilities.

As our society has been evolving, family life has lost a great deal of its support. Take family meal with the father and mother with their children together. As this becomes infrequent, what is at risk of being weakened or disappearing?

Let's look Joseph and Mary and their Son, Jesus. What natural values supported them? As these values are weakened by various scheduling, by the cell

phone and by broken relationships, what can be done?

The Word of Life today speaks to the importance of the father and mother to the child. Reverence for them is seen as very profound by Sirach. Luke sites what was taken for granted, "the child grew and became strong."

There are three values that are foundational to maturity. They are to flow from the bond of mutual love between a husband and a wife. Children are meant to obey them in everyone, so says Paul to the people of Colossae.

Silence to reflect in peace and quiet to listen to the voice of God in the midst of "noise with so many contradictions." With parents to listen to share wisdom and give counsel and to encourage learning, what a gift this would be.

<u>Family life</u> would be the safe space for sharing the values that are held sacred and the problems that secular world will raise. What a wonderful gift of unconditional love and trust that create a climate of hope against hope .

<u>Discipline of work</u> is understood as each family joins with each other's family to be responsible to use our talents for the common good. Labor is learned to have its own dignity, make our economy work and care for each other a reality.

As we celebrate Holy Family, I invite us to reflect upon the quality of our personal and parish family. Silence leads to wise and mature decisions? Family life turns obstacles into opportunities? Work is fulfilling? How are we all doing?




