



**Born After 1973 – the Baton Is A Work-In-Progress
Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R.
September 26, 2021 - 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time
Numbers 11:25-29 & Mark 9:38-49 with James 5:1-6**

I would ask each of you to recall the names of your children. Write them down on a piece of paper. As you write down their names, put down their confirmation name. Now I would ask you to share why you are a Catholic and why you pass on your faith.

Step back and listen to Moses passing on to others his spirit. Moses' challenge is to do so or else he would burn out and be the last leader to stand. Match that with the panic of Jesus' followers. They saw demons driven out by people not sent by Jesus.

The response to the followers of Moses and of Jesus – You have the truth to share, do it. But if God chooses others to share, as long as they're not against us they are for us. Your challenge is to do the same, not to scandalize your children and others.

Church, we have a powerful gift. We have the Eucharist that is what comes from death. We have the Bread of Life and the Wine of Freedom – Life out of death and freedom out of slavery. Do we understand how rich we are? How free we are?

Church, we need to step up to the powerful teaching of James – “Rich, weep and wail over your impending miseries...” People are crying for life after death. People are looking for meaning after the money matters not. And are we willing to give?

Would these questions be confusing to your Confirmed children? Would they have any idea that the Eucharist is the “riches” they receive in order for them to give the Life of the Resurrection through forgiving and being forgiven?

In our country that holds “we are free to choose” it is very tempting to forget we are “chosen to be free.” The Word of Life today wakes us up to look at our way of life. Have we been a source of scandal to our children by what we do and say?

I want to find a way to discern the spirit you have passed on to your children. As I look to our becoming a “Family of parishes,” I want to listen to your children and their children. Do they believe they were given a gift of Resurrection and of Reconciliation? Do they want to support fellow followers of Jesus, chosen to be sent to renew the earth?
