



He Wants Us To Be Reconciled – Do We? 4th Sunday of Lent – Jos.5:9-12 & Lk 15:1-32 with 2Cor.5:17-21 By Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. – Pastor

All are made to be reconciled beginning within ourselves. This is Paul's message to the Confirmed Christians of his day. He had received forgiveness from Christ, the Risen Lord, for persecuting the followers of the Way of forgiving without conditions.

The message we are to bring to others is given to us in the story of the Prodigal Son. We are to take the position of the forgiving Father. God had removed the reproach of the Egyptians. The people celebrated the Passover to seal the removal.

Jesus would take the Passover celebration to give deeper meaning to it. He would seal the gift of forgiving, wanting both sides of every disagreement removed. We are chosen to be Christ's Ambassadors. We are sent to promote this value.

When I see Russia and the Ukraine, when I hear of the Racial divide, when I hear the way one side speaks of the other, I know we have a long way to go. We are called to want those who do wrong to be reconciled when they ask forgiveness.

Wanting to say "Father, forgive them. They do not know what they are doing." This is our call. This is our message. We are to promote such an intuition. We are to be the father forgiving the one who did wrong and to want the other brother to do the same.

In Christ we are a new creation. Our fallen human nature is the same, prone to sin and in need of forgiveness. All more reason to want to promote forgiveness, even when the other side refuses to want to do the same.

In a world of violence, we are sent to encourage peace through healing both the wrongdoers and those who are wronged. Let's examine our consciences for any doing of wrong and ask God to forgive us. Then let's reflect on the times we may not have invited others to forgive those who wronged them.

When we hear of people who do wrong, do we speak up to pray others want to forgive and be reconciled with them? This is the call to give peace a chance, beginning with our closest relationship and having the ripple-effect through us to others
