Show Up And Show Out – We're To Go Public Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. January 3, 2021 - Epiphany of Our Lord Isaiah 60:1-6 & Matthew 2:1-12 with Ephesians 3:2-6

The first teaching to the Confirmed as St. Paul's writes, is "We are stewards of God's grace." He immediately teaches us "grace is given to us for other's benefit." Keep this insight given to us in mind when we hear the message from the Word of God today.

Both Isaiah and Matthew center on the Star. They both share it rises in the West attracting foreign leaders (kings as they name them). Two gifts both agree were brought were gold and frankincense. In Matthew is added myrrh ... used for anointing.

Obviously the birth of the new-born King was important beyond the Jewish community. It was recognized by other world religions, as represented in the Magi. For the Magi they were overjoyed, just the opposite of those ruling over the Jewish people.

We all know of the slaughter of the "Holy Innocents", male children under the age of two. It is mentioned the Kings did not report as they were told, as they were inspired to go home by another route.

How does this event speak to us as we begin the year 2021? What a powerful challenge we are given. Knowing what we know of the Redemptive Love of Jesus, we are asked by Paul to do what he did – the promise to be coheirs and partners is open!

The momentum of "Unleash the Gospel" is inviting us to share in the context of the situation in which we find ourselves. We are coming out of the Pandemic. We are hoping to share the "vaccine" with as many people as possible and as soon as possible.




