Authority – Make Life Grow – Whom Do We Want To Please? Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. January 31, 2021 - 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time Deuteronomy 18:15-20 & Mark 1:21-28 with 1 Corinthians 7:22-25

What is the relationship between the married and the single ways of life? To hear this question in 2021 is in an environment different from that of St. Paul. True. But is it all that different so that this teaching from the Word of God has nothing to say to us?

The public conversation around marriage and what it means is in the world of compromise for some. And when the debate happens, people speak with the kind of authority that can be impressive at times. But at the end of the day, is there growth?

Jesus spoke with authority in the spirit of Moses. He was prophetic. He spoke not only in the name of God. He spoke as having the authority of God. His motive was pure. He was sent to call us all to mature in our love for each other for His Father's glory.

What did he say about marriage? He values the relationship so much that He inspired Paul to compare His relationship to the Church to the bond between a husband and a wife. He was a single man who sees the Church born of Mary as His bride.

Why? I invite you to listen to the word "please" as Paul explains. To please God is the focus of the unmarried man or woman. To please the spouse is the focus of the husband and the wife. And it divides the married. True. But is it good to love this way?

In fact, it's not only good. It's excellent. Without married love, family life would be difficult to sustain. Society would weaken its authority to raise children. And the fall of a civilization would gradually unfold.

Put simply, there is need for balance. Both the married and the single ways of life and love complement each other. This is what makes a community of faith radiate hope. This is the key to building up of the Body of Christ.

Let's pray for both ways of loving. The married to encourage the single to show them how to please God. And the single to encourage the married to show them how to please each other. Sounds like the only commandment – love God with our whole heart and mind and heart and love our neighbor as ourselves – two are one and one for all.


