



Fatalistic Future or Fascinating Formation – What Do You Hear?

Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R.

February 7, 2021 - 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Job 7:1-7 & Mark 1:29-39 with 1 Corinthians 9:16-23

Job sees his life as an assignment to misery, like the wind never to see happiness. Have you met anyone like Job? Have you felt that way before? Does your night drag on and come to an end without hope? Listen to what Mark has to say!

Jesus touched their mother's hand and her fever left her. The sick and those possessed with demons were cured and set free. He kept moving to fulfill the purpose for which he came ... to heal, to free and to leave His disciples to do what He did!

Who taught me Jesus' response to Job's way of seeing? St. Paul in his letter to the people of Corinth. As the organizers of the Word of Life designed this weekend, they chose Paul's teaching to be an ideal awareness to heal and free fallen human nature.

"To the weak I became weak, to win over the weak. I have become all things to all, to save at least some. All this I do for the sake of the Gospel, so that I too may have a share in it." The confirmed are sent to follow the model of Paul.

We are given grace, the grace of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. We are given the cure to the seven capital sins. That's why we are here at this time, in this place, with our talents to preach the Gospel free of charge always – use words if you need to do so.

Every time I hear someone ask me, "How can they do that? Don't they know better?" I want to say back, "Your question is the answer. No, they don't know better." Then I want to continue with, "Do you want to know why they don't know?" No one shared in words they can understand - people like them, people like you and me.

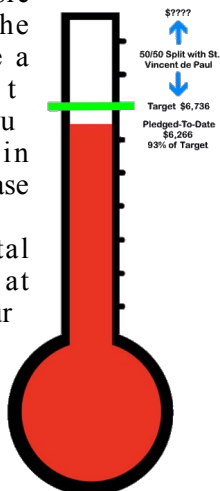
