Leap For Joy – Rejoice – Our Gift For Others Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. February 13, 2022 – 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time Jeremiah 17:5-8 & Luke 6:17-26 with 1 Corinthians 15:12-20

Black History month brings forth the faith of fathers and families that endured the results of systemic slavery. The Gospel speaks of poverty and hunger, weeping and hatred as the condition of the chosen. Do we believe this is true?

Social media is bringing these facts to light. As Jeremiah wrote – we can't trust human beings. It will all end in emptiness and waste like being in a desert, with no hope. The film "Who We Are – The Chronicle of Racism" – it shows how undeniably evil it is.

My response, and I pray to be our response, is the response of St. Paul. Christ is raised from the dead. He is clear as to where his hope comes. It comes from Jesus being raised from the dead. And this faith is the way God brings forth life out of death.

Listen to the vision of hope that comes through Jeremiah and Jesus. Blessed are those who trust in the Lord. They are rooted near water that sustains them through the most challenging of droughts.

The "woes" of Jesus are directed toward the rich and the satisfied, those who enjoy life and receive recognition. Why is this the result of what they have done with their lives? Because they gained at the expense of those left behind.

To heal the effects of sin calls for grace, the grace of the Resurrection. I remember "Resurrection City" in 1963 on the lawn and pool between the Washington Monument and Lincoln's Statue. This was the location for the "I have a Dream" speech.

We are called to be disciples of Jesus. We are called to see as He sees, to speak as He speaks, to act as He acts. We are chosen to leap for joy. Why? Because we know the resurrection has been, is now and will be for those who trust in Jesus.

Let's read the signs of the times. The more there is discouragement the more there is the call to encourage. The more there is fear the more there is the need for love. We are being sent now more than ever to radiate redemptive love, to heal the wounds of division and to invite others to want to be wounded healers.
