A Clear Conscience Through The Resurrection – What This Means? Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. February 21, 2021 - 1st Sunday of Lent Genesis 9:8-15 & Mark 1:12-15 with 1 Peter 3:18-22

"Put to death in the flesh ... bring to life in the spirit" – the seed of this truth is planted by the greatest lover – Jesus. He overcame all temptations to stop God's plan. He stayed true to Life even in when facing Death. When evil wins, it loses in the end.

The message that unfolds for those who search to find it centers on a bond that cannot be broken. This bond is actually stronger for the test than it would be, had it not had to face such resistance, such threat.

A rainbow is the symbol of life after death. The multicolored arc that appeared as the sun broke through the clouds after the flood was a powerful sign of life after death to Noah. The Word of Life records this moment to make the statement "Never again."

Forty days was given as Noah's time in the ark. Forty days was given as Jesus' time in the desert. Forty days for those writing the Word was to say it includes everything – to them the earth was flat. Four corners times 10 means "that's all there is."

Jesus withstood "all there is" just as Noah withstood "all there is" - the power of evil did his best to destroy life. But the truth lives after it's all over, the love of God comes back to life for those who are faithful to the promise – faithful to baptism.

We are living in disturbing times. We are living in the midst of division that is testing the spirit in ways many seem unable to sustain. Not just the pandemic but the way people are together against the other side.



Black History Month Celebration - Legacy of Leaders


