For Christ's Sake – Let's Be Fools Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. March 7, 2021 - 3rd Sunday of Lent Exodus 20:1-17 & John 2:13-25 with 1 Corinthians 1:22-25

What is foolishness for Christ sake? What is weakness to fallen human nature? St. Paul is right up front with the political leaders in the Greek world that founded democracy. St. Paul knows what he is promoting is a stumbling block to his culture.

We have before us today the defining message of the power greater than human. Each person at some point in life is called to question: Do I believe in God – in the God Who brings me out of slavery that leads to death or not?

As Catholic Christians we are being called to want to return to face-to-face prayer with each other. We are being encouraged to want to receive the God we love; in Whom we entrust our lives. As the psalmist says, "You have the words of everlasting Life!"

Did you notice how long those who put their faith and trust in anyone or anything lasts? Three to four generations will be the punishment. But to those who entrust their lives to God their way of life is blessed to the thousandth generation?

Jesus challenges His own culture and fellow Jewish leaders of faith. Don't use Our Father's house for any reason but to give praise and glory to God, the One Who set us free from being controlled by any power less than human.

We are coming out of a long year of testing our spirit. The pandemic has been a test for the global world and each of us in it. That's true. But as I reflect upon our time, I see the deeper test is, "Am I now aware of my God more than before?"

Now I am called to see death leads to life as the Sign that Jesus gives to those He challenged at the beginning of His Public Ministry. And He gives the same sign to us today. Jesus is full of zeal for His Father. He wants his culture and people to be free.

Yes! to the vaccine, to the stimulus package, to "back to school," to jobs, to whatever spells relief. May we say "Amen" to Jesus who gave us the sign of truth – death leads to life and not the other way. Keep our focus on God Whom alone we know, love and serve, as modeled by Marcela and Ron who did their best to be blessings to us.
