The Food Is For Eternity To Enter Time – We're Chosen To Do It! Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. August 8, 2021 - 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time 1 Kings 19:4-8 & John 6:41-51 with Ephesians 4:30-5:2

If we would let ourselves be open to embrace the meaning of the Bread of Life, we would discover a way of life that can do nothing more than be "kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ."

Elijah had no reason to live. He was in the desert, abandoned by everyone. He wanted to lay down and die. Many people during the pandemic were caught up in the same dynamic. Toying with taking their own lives ... feeling useless and hopeless.

Jesus grew up among similar people. They defined their lives by what they had. And Jesus saw their lives, as He saw His own, bringing eternal life into space and time. He just up and said it after multiplying loaves. "I am the Bread ... from heaven."

It's like He couldn't take it anymore. They were trying to define Jesus as being the son of Joseph. They knew His parents. They rejected His Word based on what they knew. No wonder their way of thinking would lead to bitterness, anger and malice.

Take Saul who was out to kill the followers of the Way, of those chosen to be sent. He is chosen to see Jesus in those who receive the Bread of Life. He is changed for good. He was sent to the other group – not the Jews, but the Gentiles.

"Live in love" – overcome fear and discouragement. How? With the power of the Bread of Life. Paul goes on to say "be imitators of God." What a teaching – we are to imitate God. How? With the Bread of Life. "We are what we eat" said St. Augustine.

God's Word is right on time. No surprise since His Word is eternal. We are the chosen ones to bring L.I.F.E. into our community – Love Including Forgiving Everyone! Our God is an awesome God choosing us to be sent as "Doers of the Word of Life."

When I hear of "traumatic" experiences, I want to accompany others to mourn and grieve the loss. It wasn't meant to be this way. It's the result of our cutting off the Creator, beginning with Adam. Then I bring to light the "Eucharistic Heart of Jesus." He is bleeding in the Cup of Blessing, our Wounded Healer. He chose us to do the same.

Our Mission Statement
