Life Is On-The-Job Training – Are We Willing To Walk In Faith? Reflection from Ed Shea August 15, 2021 - Feast of the Assumption Revelation 11:19a;12:1-6a,10b & Luke 1:39-56 with 1 Corinthians 15:20-27

Parents know that their newborn baby does not come with an operating manual. Hopefully, there are grandparents or great-grandparents to pass on the wisdom gained from their own experiences, but raising children almost always comes down to on-the-job training.

So what about our Blessed Mother? She was told that the Spirit of God would descend upon her and she would give birth to the Son of God. Would this be a different kind of birth? No – Jesus is "fully human," and so was His birth. "She was with child and wailed aloud in pain as she labored to give birth."

We don't know exactly what Mary knew when she said "Yes," but we do know that she walked in faith – trusting in God. Her cousin Elizabeth knew how important this would be as she proclaimed, "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

Mary's journey would not be any easier than for most mothers, and, arguably, far more difficult. She would flee to Egypt with Joseph and the baby Jesus to escape Herod, and would ultimately watch as her son was cruelly beaten and killed. Yet she remained to provide on-the-job training to the Apostles as they gave birth to the Church.

Mary's glorious assumption, body and soul, into Heaven is a recognition of the pivotal role she played in salvation history. She walked in faith – believing in God's plan, even without a manual. "For since death came through man, the resurrection of the dead came also through man."

Are we willing, individually and as a faith community, to walk in faith? Are we able to say "Yes" to God's plan for us, even before we know what that plan is? Like Mary, we are here to bring God's kingdom to earth. We learn as we go. May each of us one day join our Blessed Mother in saying, "From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me and holy is his Name."
