



**Do We Want To See How To Be Both-And?
Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R.
September 5, 2021 - 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time
Isaiah 35:4-7 & Mark 7:31-37 with James 2:1-5**

We are citizens of a nation that has enormous power. The pandemic has a resurgence. We are looking for a “booster”. The hurricane is hitting our southern borders. We are sending “help.” Afghanistan is a threat. We respond “in kind.”

What did James teach the first followers of Jesus? There were two groups of people in his day – rich and poor – no different from today. James faulted favoring the rich over the poor. In fact, James shared that Jesus chose to be poor.

James would not have used the word “equity.” But what he taught is now lifted up as making sure we all have equal opportunity, equal access. The challenge for us the chosen is to show how to bring this insight into the situations in which we live.

Isaiah encourages his people to be strong hearted, free from fear. He goes on to share how God opens eyes, hearing for the deaf, dancing for the lame and speech for the mute. God sides with the fearful hearts and frees them with His Love.

Jesus is given a person who is deaf. The physical loss of hearing distorts what a person understands. To be deaf spiritually means you cannot listen to the truth. Jesus touched the man and cured him. Jesus wanted the man to have equitable opportunity.

Do you hear the message from the Word of Life for us today? Do you hear that we are being sent to bring insight to the spiritually blind, understanding to the spiritually deaf? I see and hear our call to challenge “haves” to be compassionate to “have nots.”

To be examples to others we will need to be healed of our hurts and be ready to share what Jesus calls us to do. To take the side of the “have nots” calls for constant virtue on the inside and clear vision on the outside. We are able to respond. Will we?

I listen to the “virus and variant”. Will I model what is best for the common good? I hear of violence on our streets or in other parts of the world. Will I speak and act with compassion for both sides? Do we want to see evil for what it is, against both sides? Do we want to free both sides to heal and understand, equitable, rich and poor in harmony?

MEN BRIDGING CHANGE: A Vicariate "Blessing for our men!"

After the successful launch of *Women Bridging Change* through the Family of Parishes of Detroit, this September throughout the Trinity Vicariate, Life Directions is inaugurating the *Men Bridging Change* program - a 16-week program that addresses issues that burden men, as regards to unhealed hurts.
