

“Because Of The Hardness Of Their Hearts Moses Permitted”

Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R.

October 3, 2021 – 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Genesis 2:18-24 & Mark 10:2-16 with Hebrews 2:9-11

“The Theology Of The Body” is a series of twenty-nine major lectures written by St. John Paul II. He focused on one verse “That is why a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife, and the two of them become one flesh.”

Jesus came back to this teaching of the heart of the creation. The Pharisees wanted to test Jesus. Jesus took the occasion to explain what He will use to show the power of redemptive love – the covenant between a husband and a wife.

The wounded world in which we live surfaces the hardness of our hearts. From the womb to the tomb – from abortion to nuclear arms – the human person based on self-preservation will kill or threaten to kill. It’s our human condition.

Paul wants to give us an example of Christ and His Church. He uses the idea of marriage between a husband and a wife. This covenant relationship is the source of the healing of human hearts. We are confirmed into the covenant to be wounded healers.

Paul’s letter, that will focus on the priesthood of Melchisedek, is where he shares the way our leader to our salvation was made perfect ... through suffering. The Word was made flesh that He might taste death for everyone.

Listen as a doctor to the diagnosis of the divisive energy of the 21st century. We are in the struggle of marriage, family, community, country, continent, planet to redeem fallen human nature that has been killing since the first two children of the first marriage.

If we know why we are to heal and forgive, we will receive the grace to do the impossible. “Accept the kingdom of God like a child ... He embraced them and blessed them.” The Little Flower’s feast was Friday. She’s the patroness of the Foreign Mission.

Let’s remember we are chosen to be sent to bring healing to the sick and their children. St. John Paul II introduced the “Mysteries of Light” to pray for the Gospel of Light. Jesus went public baptized by John. Mary asked her Son to bless the wedding. Jesus proclaimed the Joy of the Gospel, was transfigured and entered the Eucharist.

2021 Catholic Services Appeal

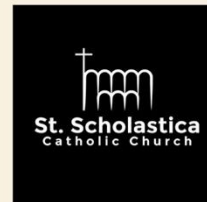
