Receive The Word In Affliction - With Joy From The Holy Spirit Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. October 25, 2020 - 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time Exodus 22:20-26 & Matthew 22:34-40 with 1 Thessalonians 1:5-10

The insight that Paul is sharing with the people of Thessalonica was revealed to him. He's passing it on to them fresh from his time he spent deepening his awareness of the powerful revelation that he received after he was baptized.

Affliction and discouragement, fear and despair are all part of life. If someone responds with joy, he or she has received the grace from the Holy Spirit. This is the grace that comes with Confirmation. Why? Because it's a grace meant for others.

You and I who know Jesus in the flesh – here in the form of Bread and Wine – we have the gift that was born out of the martyrdom of our Servant Master. It is the grace to be on mission. It is the grace to be willing to lose our life in the name of Jesus.

Our city needs martyrs of hope, people who believe without seeing and love without being loved. You're right. It's not normal. It doesn't make sense. Humanly! But for those who want to imitate Christ Jesus, with prayer it can become second nature.

This coming long weekend will include Halloween, All Saints and All Souls days. The day after that is the feast of St. Martin de Porres. That also happens to be Election Day in our country. Coincidence? It's God's way of being anonymous!

I invite you to want to develop a pattern of prayer, the exercise that Martyrs of Hope do in order to respond with joy in affliction, with love to enemies and in faith to people who are proud that they are spiritual and not religious.


The message that I hear when I reflect on Moses' and Jesus' teaching is to love God means to love our neighbor who lacks what he or she needs. It's loving the way God loves us. Such a way of life can silence the cynics and pessimists of our day.

I have developed a pattern of prayer by getting up an hour before I need to. I start with a Mary's prayer – "Thanks for giving me" and I add what I'm thankful for. I read three psalms, a message from the saint of the day and from the Word. I pause to let silence digest what I ate – 15 minutes. Then I'm ready. Try it. You may like it!
