Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R.

October 31, 2021 – 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Deuteronomy 6:2-6 & Mark 12:28-34 with Hebrews 7:23-28

Halloween is in the midst of a long week-end. October 30 was the transformed “Devil’s into Angel’s Night.” Today the customs surrounding “Trick o’ Treat” are modified with All Saints to remember the unrecognized and All Souls to pray the others make it!

I hear the Word of Life speaking to our situation today. I invite you to hear Jesus speaking to us as He spoke to one of the Scribes as He declared the two-sided law. H.E.A.R. O Christians: “Hope Excels Advancing Reconciliation” – Love God with ...

All our Hearts – this is the center of our convictions. This is the part of the body that gives what it wants to receive. For love to have room to enter our hearts we have to give what we want to receive. Are we convicted to give hope to others?

All our Souls – this is the gift of eternal life. The soul never ages. To keep our spirit powerful and life-giving is to want to give and receive what brings hope through us to others. Are we enthusiastic to love others as we love ourselves?

All our Minds – this is the gift of others to us. To want to develop our minds to grow in wisdom is to study and reflect on what others give to us through all forms of the media. Are we open to learn from others as we share what we believe?

All our Strengths – this is key to justice and peace that leads to joy. Our talents are meant to complement others as theirs are meant to empower us. What an awesome God we have – to make life grow through teamwork. Are we open to diversity?

Do we love our neighbors, both those we like and those who are not our “cup of tea,” as we love ourselves? Do we give before we expect to receive? Do we live in awe of our Creator? Do we receive what others give? Do we complement each other?

It’s such a simple summary of the Word of Life. Jesus puts His whole heart and soul, mind and strength into His Mission. He chose us to do the same. He chose us to know Him in the Breaking of the Bread. We have all we need to do what He commands. I want to thank you who encourage me to have a joy that lasts, as I pray to do for you.

Parish Pastoral Council Elections

Under the Family of Parishes structure, the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is no longer required; the Family will have a Pastoral Council with representatives from each parish in the Family. The 5 elected members will represent the Mission Commission, the Ministry Commission, the Stewardship Commission, the Administration/Formation Teams, and the Evangelization/Pastoral Teams.

Beginning next week, slips of paper will be available for 2 weeks for submission of nominees here in church or by mail to the parish office, and online submission will be available through the parish website. The final results will be announced by Father John at the November 21 Mass.
