Accompany Others With Joy Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. December 12, 2021 – 3rd Sunday of Advent Zephaniah 3:14-18 & Luke 3:10-18 with Philippians 4:4-7

Our Lady of Guadalupe – Mother of the Americas – is the feast through North, Central and South America! Today we connect this celebration with "Rejoice" Sunday – in Latin called "Gaudete" Sunday. All joy is defined as Accompaniment. Why?

Listen to Paul – Kindness is known. The Lord is near. No anxiety. Pray and ask for others thankfully. Paul is so clear. We're all in this together. We are companions on the journey – active and passive Catholics, people of all faiths and of good will!

Where are we sent to share our joy – to shout our joy – to sing our joy? In the Hebrew scriptures we hear today – where there is fear and discouragement. In the Christian scriptures – be practical – give, be equitable, no false accusations.

To the extent we live this way we will be guarding our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. We look to Jesus Who chose us to be His companions. We look to Jesus Who sends us to prepare the way for others to see our Tremendous Lover.

The Tilma – the picture of Our Lady of Guadalupe – quickly became the Flag of Justice of the Indigenous and of Peace for the slaves. What a powerful message in the middle of the Americas seen too often as taking, unequal and blaming others!

We are less than two weeks from Christmas. Last Sunday Life Directions celebrated its work in Public Schools and in Catholic Parishes with three traditions – Kwanza – Posada – Santa Claus. Values in the context of the story ended with giving!

Next weekend our youth and young adults want to retreat to deepen their way of praying as Catholic Christian. We will position prayer in the midst of the "mess" of our lives and open us to discover the "message" within the mess to awaken "messengers."

I invite us all to remember our journey into the solitude of this season – the first time found Joseph and Mary ending up alone in a barn. There was no room for them where travelers lodged. Accompany us in spirit for we hope to see you next Sunday hoping you want to "mentor" the next generations who will "manage" what we hand on.
