# The Peace Of Christ Control Our Hearts Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. December 27, 2020 - Feast of the Holy Family Sirach 3:2-14 & Luke 2:22-40 with Colossians 3:12-21

The lesson plan by the Creator to heal the hurts of the human experience centers on the family – the husband and wife with child. It was that dynamic that let go of Good as its source of life and let Evil seduce and deceive. What an awesome God we have!



## January 1 - Mary, Mother of God


