# By Our Fruit We Will Know Ourselves Reflection by Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. – Pastor February 27, 2022 – 8<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time Sirach 27:4-7 & Luke 6:39-45 with 1 Corinthians 15:54-58

Do we believe Jesus conquered death, as St. Paul says? Let's listen to our self-talk. Let's listen to our thoughts and our feelings. Let's go deep inside ourselves. Let's look at how we look at what is happening around us.

To say "Yes, I believe Jesus has conquered death" is to know the foundation of our hope. It is not in anything or anyone that can die including ourselves. It is totally based on the resurrection.

When I went for my open heart surgery, it was the first time that I could remember where the question of believing in the resurrection was in my conscious mind. Am I aware that my life could be coming to an end?

I became conscious of my approach to physical health. I took it for granted. Now I would not be free to continue that way. I would need to be careful about a lot of things that I hadn't been before, if I wanted to live. I needed to be humble.

About that time my spiritual director shared with me the meaning of the parable of the "splinter in your eye." He shared how Joseph taught his Son the relationship between youth and elders. The phrase "get off you high horse" captures the lesson.

Youth have energy – physical power. Elders have experience – mental wisdom. To cut the wood with a long saw, the younger goes up and stands on the plank to push and pull the saw. The older person guides the saw to be precise and accurate.

If a splinter gets in the eye of the elder, the younger person must get off his high horse to take the splinter out of the elder's eye. Jesus asks us to learn from His being gentle and humble. Listen to our thoughts, words, actions. Are we humble?

We talk. We reveal the lessons we learned from so many sources. Isn't it sad when we hear someone or even more sad when we ourselves speak without being gentle and humble, especially if we are older? But what joy we offer the young when we share encouragement to the next generation. Gentleness invites humility. Let's do it.

## Lenten/Holy Week Worship Schedule

Lent begins this Wednesday, March 2, Ash Wednesday. Our Lenten theme is **Passion**, **Death**, **Resurrection**: **Are We Willing to be Transformed into the Resurrected Christ?** 

This holy season provides us a special opportunity to grow closer to Jesus as we reflect on how He suffered and died for us, only to bring eternal hope through His glorious resurrection. Following is a summary of our worship schedule. Details on specific services will be provided when available.

• Ash Wednesday (3/2) Mass & Distribution of Ashes at 12:00 noon and 6:00 p.m.

Every Friday (3/4 - 4/8) Stations of the Cross at 6:30 p.m.
Holy Thursday (4/14) Mass at 7:00 p.m.

• Good Friday (4/15) Stations of the Cross at 12:00 noon Liturgy at 1:00 p.m.

• Holy Saturday (4/16) Easter Vigil Mass at 8:00 p.m.

• Easter Sunday (4/17) Mass at 10:00 a.m.

Lent is a time of reconciliation, as we prepare ourselves to receive the graces of Jesus' resurrection. We will have a Reconciliation Service as part of our Mass on March 27. However, keep in mind that the Sacrament of Reconciliation is available every Sunday for about one-half hour before Mass.
