Remember The Vision in the Valley Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. March 8, 2020 - 2nd Sunday of Lent Genesis 12:1-4 & Matthew 17:1-9 with 2 Timothy 1:8-10

"Saved and called us to a holy life ... according to his own design and grace bestowed on us in Christ Jesus before time began." Did you hear what I heard? The Father designed our relationship to His Son. Why? So we would respond to the call!

Did God design Abram before he became Abraham? Could it have been that others said no? Did Jesus design and grace Peter, James and John to come to the mountain top? Could others have been asked and said no?

Is Christ Jesus designing and gracing those He has chosen to call to a holy life with Him here in Eucharist? Are we here because He called us, like He called Abram and Peter, James and John? Could others have said no? Will we?

Do you know what happened to Abram? He became Abraham – the father fashioned a people out of many nations. He only had one son, had to believe in the One Who chose him and be willing to sacrifice his son, Isaac.

Do you know what happened to Peter, James and John? They were the three to be with Him in the garden to support Him. Jesus let them see His Transfigured Body. He explained His death as they were coming down the mountain. Only John stayed.

We've been chosen for this moment to live in Motown as it's becoming rich. We are not that rich. We average \$2,444.00 a month - \$81.50 a day – based on what we all wrote on the cards last Sunday. Let's reflect on our talents and time. They are priceless.

The capitalistic community wouldn't see what we have as worth much. But the Christian community? That's a different story. We know the value of our time and talent even in the absence of treasury. Let me quote what some people wrote on their cards.

"I tithe on my \$3,200 a month." "All I have is \$20.00 but I have time and a heart to give." "I am limited living on social security." "All I have is time. I have nothing." Church, we are so blessed to be together. We are a blessing to fellow Catholics and Christians. We have life worth living. Isn't it a joy that we have each other just the way we are?



Stewardship Thoughts

In today's Scripture passage from the Book of Genesis, God calls Abram (later Abraham) to a new land, vowing to bless him and make of him a great nation. Abraham faithfully and immediately follows God's directive. In the Gospel from the evangelist St. Matthew, Jesus' divinity is revealed to Peter, James, and John through His Transfiguration on the mountaintop. The Lord directs the disciples to not disclose the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead. They faithfully obey this command. In his Second Letter to Timothy, St. Paul refers to holiness: He [God] saved us and called us to a holy life. Church leaders embraced this invitation to holiness at the Second Vatican Council. Pursuing evangelization through Christian stewardship brings us to a closer relationship with Christ. Are we striving to obey God's will in our lives? And, in this effort, are we striving for holiness? This Lenten season, make a spiritual retreat to open your heart to Jesus.
