

Jesus....The Resurrection and the Life

What will it take for us to Believe so we can be Sent?

5th Sunday of Lent – Ezek.37:12-14 & Jn.11:1-45 with Rm.8:8-11 – March 26, 2023

The theme that flows from the first reading into the Gospel is from death comes life. But do you notice the theme isn't complete till we hear the last phrase – "They began to believe". They didn't believe. Sit with that question.

Seeing is believing is not true for those who saw Lazarus. Why not? Paul points to the reason. It is so clear. Teachings like "the flesh cannot please God" and "not in the flesh but in the spirit" to end with "the spirit dwells in us." Let's open the insights.

When any of us are at the home going of someone we love and someone shares that the person is not dead but change in appearance, does that touch us emotionally? When we heard that Jesus wept with Martha and Mary and all of them, emotionally...


Jesus Who knew what He was going to do, wept. Loss is real and it can touch us to the core. When I celebrated my father's Mass of the Resurrection, I wept almost out of control before I went into the Church. I felt the loss in a very profound way.

At that point I most appreciated the touch of a friend, someone who wanted to be with me and be silent. At that moment of death, silence is the language of comfort. It is what grieving is meant to be. The flesh has died because of fallen human nature.

Jesus then wipes away His tears. He stands up and declares, "roll away the stone." The miracle of life out of death is about to be shared. The response to death is to be life, life that never dies. As Paul puts it, "give life ... through the Spirit dwelling..."

This Spirit dwelling in us is the Holy Spirit. When the Holy Spirit dwells in our mortal bodies, we are Christ. We are Christian. We are life giving. We are sent. Yes, we are sent. As God said through Ezekiel "I promise. I will do it."

The Spirit raised Jesus from the dead. Christ is resurrected in our bodies. Why? To be sent to overcome worry and doubt, competition, and fear – to redeem and heal fallen human nature. Baptism is Resurrection. Confirmation is Pentecost. We grow into life by giving to others what we ourselves received. What will it take? It takes being sent.
