Jesus Walks It All ... Pain ... Death ... LIFE Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. April 5, 2020 - Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion Isaiah 50:4-7 & Matthew 26:14-27:66 with Philippians 2:6-11

As we begin Holy Week 2020 with the Corona virus making us keep social distancing, I invite us to come closer through spiritual connecting. Let us enter the journey of Jesus to heal our wounded world. I invite us to reflect through St. Paul's letter to the **Philippians** reflecting upon the SEVEN LAST WORDS of our Tremendous Lover.

He didn't grasp at being divine. I became like you so you could become like Me. When you crucified me, I didn't want to lose you. That's why the first word I spoke was "Father, forgive them. They don't know what they're doing." I say it every time you sin.

He takes the form of a slave. I'm patiently waiting for you to want to be with Me. When you say you have no time, I hope you don't try to steal heaven and hope to hear "This day you will be with Me in Paradise." Do you love me now? Do you want Me now?

He has our human likeness. I looked down on My mother. I received my human life from her. "Mother, behold your son. Son, behold your mother." I pray you let her show you how to love me. She is the one loving Me unconditionally the day I passed.

He has our human appearance. I am focused on bringing you to fall in love with Me. "I thirst" for you more than I need to quench my natural thirst. My way to express My love for you is to thirst to love those who hate Me, those who wrong Me. Will

A Verse a Day For You to Pray

Today: Philippians 2:6-8: Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

Monday: Isaiah 42:6: I, the LORD, have called you for the victory of justice, I have grasped you by the hand; I formed you, and set you as a covenant of the people, a light for the nations.

Tuesday: Psalms 71:1-2: In you, O LORD, I take refuge; let me never be put to shame. In your justice rescue me, and deliver me; incline your ear to me, and save me.

Wednesday: Isaiah 50:7,9a: The Lord GOD is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame. See, the Lord GOD is my help; who will prove me wrong?

Thursday: John 13:14-15: Jesus said to his disciples: "If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet. I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do."

Friday: Hebrews 5:8-9: Brothers and sisters: Son though he was, Christ learned obedience from what he suffered; and when he was made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him.

Saturday: Matthew 28:5-6: The angel said to Mary Magdalene, "Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay."
