Devoted ... Forgive and be Forgiven! Divine Mercy – Ac.2:42-47 & Jn.20:19-31 with 1Pt.1:3-9 – April 16, 2023 By Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. – Priest in Solidum

Beginning on Good Friday, the day Jesus made good on his promise to forgive in the face of extreme violence, to today the Novena for Divine Mercy has been celebrated. This is the novena to unlock "fear" by forgiving seven times seventy times.

What kept them in fear? They did not want to believe what they saw and heard. Only when Thomas the twin touched His side did they believe. Thomas challenged all of them to "go to Jerusalem and die with him" (John 11:16). Thomas was fearless.

Devoted people are people of faith following in the spirit of Mary, Jesus' devoted mother. Devoted people know the four interdependent aspects of a life of a Christian that is persevering for the long run. That's why Tom knew Jesus kept the nail marks.

First, the teaching of the Apostles is "to receive the Holy Spirit" in Confirmation so that whose sins are forgiven are forgiven and those sins are retained are retained. The only sin retained is the sin of not forgiving – this is the sin against the Holy Spirit.


Second, find the common ground. "As the Father sent me, I send you." Jesus kept His nail marks when He rose from the dead. His resurrected body, as His twin in the spirit knew His wounds, showed the healing power of forgiving as wounded healer.


Third, break bread together day by day. "He showed them His Hands and Side." To receive His Resurrected Body and Blood is the energy to be sent to heal others by bringing about reconciliation moving the energy of evil to wanting good for all!

Fourth, pray every day. "Peace be with you" is His greeting when He entered the "upper room" the day He rose. He breathes on them the same way this second time as He enters the room to drive out F.E.A.R. – Freedom Excels Advancing Redemption.

These are the four aspects of the journey of a Confirmed Catholic Christian. We do not need to see to love Jesus. We do not need to see to believe in Jesus. We rejoice with "indescribable and glorious joy", "attaining the goal of our faith." We attain salvation forgiving and being forgiven, attaining for ourselves and those we forgive day by day.

Observed on the second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday was established in 2000 by St. John Paul II during his canonization of St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, a 20th-century Polish mystic. As a Sister of Our Lady of Mercy, the unassuming saint shared how she enjoyed numerous visions in which Christ urged her to promote devotion to his mercy through various prayers, an annual feast, and an image featuring rays of blood and water issuing from his heart.
