Be Hospitable Be Surprised Be Blessed Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. June 28, 2020 - 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 Kings 4:8-16 & Matthew 10:37-42 with Romans 6:3-11

Often I reflect on what Jesus teaches, reflecting as He did on the Hebrew Bible, and wonder how His mother raised Him. To give you an insight into my way of seeing the signs of the times in light of the Word of God, I need to share my relationship to her.

I was ordained at her feast day – Mother of Perpetual Help – June 27. I took as my prayer "Woman, behold your son. Son, behold your mother." The devotional prayer that we Redemptorists designed captures the benchmarks to know death and see life.

The world we live in is "fallen." If sin could be understood as gravity, we might have greater respect for the Power of Evil, Satan, who leads us like he did Eve and Cain. Proud and jealous, envious and greedy – he is alive and out to destroy.

Mary was to raise her Son to heal the hurts and to nurture the gifts that would turn evil to be spelled backwards - LIVE. Her Son was born to die. His death would give re-birth to life. His life would become Baptism – the second reading today.

Our Mother of Perpetual Help – when we face difficulties, let's ask Mary to do for us what she did for Jesus. As a child Jesus ran to His mother for comfort, reassurance. As Mary received Jesus in her arms, she taught Him to know the way of the Cross.

Mary knew the "finish line" and she developed Jesus to see evil as the lack of good, darkness as the lack of light and fear as the lack of love. She "pondered what happened in her heart" and she encouraged Jesus to live a reflective life.

Mary is the model in suffering and courage. Mary is the Mentor of those who want to respond to being chosen, as she was. Mary is the seat of wisdom – she sees all that is dying knowing those who persevere will know the Resurrection.

Mary's gift of devotion to her Son and His Mission is the seventh gift of the Holy Spirit. The world turns to money as its grace. It manipulates and deceives to grow the Gross National Product. Mary is the Mediatrix of all grace. Her "yes" is faithful love at its best. May we learn from Mary how to be faithful in an unfaithful world – and enjoy!
