Feast Of The Solemnity Of The Most Holy Redeemer Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. July 19, 2020

Isaiah 55:2-6 & John 3:13-21 with Romans 5:12-21

Three words capture the sparks of the Redemptorist charism – our gift to the world: "Crib" – the joys and struggles of fallen human nature, the first spark; "Cross" – hope in the face of despair; the second spark; 'Sacrament" – the ultimate lover for His Beloved bride – the Church.

Crib, Cross, Sacrament – Redemptorists were not founded to preach ideals. Our work is not to teach the truth of faith. We don't measure our effectiveness by the numbers of people who come to what we offer.

These are very important aspects of the life of the Church. We are grateful for the people who preach ideals, teach truths and measure outcomes. The charisms that focus on these values belong in the orchestra of the Catholic Church.

But to use the analogy of an orchestra, the place Redemptorists are given for the life of our Church is to be in the mess of people who are struggling with how to live the ideals in their reality. We are meant to seek those on the edge of the active life of grace and sacraments. Our voice is meant for people for whom the Gospel is not Good News.

Be in their Crib – where they live. My way has been to find a way to be present in public life. I organize a team to be in Public Schools where the Church's teaching is against the law to share. The bible is a Book that belongs in public in a courtroom.

Engage in the Cross. Find ways to persevere to bring hope to those in hopeless situations. It's not so much about faith as much as it's about morals. As I want to join people where they are in their journey, the confessional is the preferred place. I'm like a doctor wanting to cure the sinner, like me, to not give up or give in – just forgive!

Lifting up the Eucharist. This is the sacrament for the flesh, the Word made Flesh consumes our soul in compassionate love especially for those who are lost and never heard of Jesus in the Bread and Wine! What a gift we have been given to share.

St. Paul says, "just as sin ... so has grace!" John shouts "God so loved the world ... He gave His Only Begotten Son." I plea "Seek the Lord while He may be found, call for him while He is near!" May those chosen to be sent – just do it!

Sunday Mass!!

We celebrate Eucharist very Sunday at 10:00 a.m. at Marygrove College. The church, restrooms, and all other surfaces are sanitized before and after each Mass. Hand sanitizer is available, but we encourage you to bring your own. Blue tape is in place to assist in maintaining safe social distancing. You must wear your mask at all times, except when receiving communion. There is no coffee and donuts after Mass. The lounge is closed.
