At the End of the Day It's All About Attitude Reflection from Fr. John Phelps, C.Ss.R. September 27, 2020 - 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time Ezekiel 18:25-28 & Matthew 21:28-32 with Philippians 2:1-5

The message rooted in the Hebrew Scriptures and brought to full flower in the Gospel is that "The talk is cheap. The walk is real." It's all about attitude. That's the bottom line. If only more of us would hold up this message where we walk!

To do so takes a lot of practice as I reflect upon my life. What about yourself? Let's listen to St. Paul's teaching to the Confirmed Christians of his day. He introduces a famous hymn of Jesus' passion with what he holds up as the litmus test of community.

Encourage in Christ – faith in the resurrection of the victim; Comfort in love – His Father raised Him from the persecutors; Participate in spirit – hope balances the bond.

To have the same mind as Christ is to think through what Jesus did not just what He said. To have the same love as His Father is to feel the energy of people who pick us up. To have the same heart as the Spirit is to know what it means "hope against hope."

What I find myself reflecting upon is my attitude toward both sides of so many arguments. Am I compassionate toward the people who disagree with each other? Do I breathe mercy to heal their wounds? Do I see complete joy in their forgiving the other?

St. Paul is amazing as he explains how this is possible to do. First, be aware that the outcome is not under my control. Second, the other people are more important than I am. Lastly, it's begins with starting with the other person's interests rather than mine.

Back to the message. As I write this reflection, as you read what I wrote about Ezekiel and Matthew, we haven't lived the message. It's what we do when we are sent from our gathering in prayer that matters most.

What will we say as we hear people sounding hopeless? Will we radiate a hope that comes from what the Father did after His Son was killed? He raised Him up! When people share their fears, will we encourage them as we seek to respond with love? And when people think all is impossible, will we share our faith as Mary did with Paul? At the end of the day, let's sing the song that says what happens when He emptied Himself!
