A Letter From the Pastor

"Satan's greatest weapon is man's ignorance of God's Word."

These words from AW Tozer put into perspective the importance of reading and knowing God's Word. I believe it is far too commonplace for American Christians to neglect God's Word. We neglect God's Word at our own peril, and doing so over time leads to shallow faith and weak Christians. The Bible is called a sword for a reason (Ephesians 6:17). Without it we are vulnerable to being defeated repeatedly by Satan's attacks. The Bible is our weapon to defeat Satan's lies and live faithfully for God. The Word of God is also a treasure with much help to offer for navigating life's difficulties.

"All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." 2 Timothy 3:16–17 If God seems silent in your life, how regularly do you seek to hear from God in His Word?

Many times, well-intended people begin a new year with the goal of reading the whole Bible. This is an important and worthwhile goal. If you have never read through the whole Bible, I encourage you not to give up on that goal. However, I want to encourage you to join me in taking a different approach this year. Let's set a goal as a church to read through all of the New Testament. The whole of God's inspired Word is essential to our faith. I am passionate about valuing the Old Testament as well as the New Testament. However, if our efforts to read through the whole Bible fall short somewhere in Leviticus or Numbers, then it seems worthwhile to choose a different starting point.

If you begin on January 1 (or close to it) and read 1 chapter each day beginning with Matthew 1, you will have plenty of days to completely read the New Testament by the end of the year. How amazing would it be to read the whole New Testament by the end of the year? How amazing would it be if our whole church did it? How much stronger would our faith be? How much closer to God would we feel? There is great possibilities and amazing potential in a church rich in God's Word.
