A Letter From the Pastor

It happens more often than I care to admit. I am working on something on my computer, I think of something I need to search for, and when I open a new tab to go to my search engine or email, I become distracted by all the headlines. I lose focus on what was important and begin focusing on other things.

During the time Jesus walked this earth in human flesh, the Pharisees had mastered the art of losing focus on what was important and instead focusing on other things. They specialized in focusing on the wrong things. For example, multiple times they criticized Jesus for healing people on the Sabbath. Their incorrect understanding of the Sabbath was that it was wrong for Jesus to heal on the Sabbath, because healing was a form of work and work was forbidden except for special circumstances. So, rather than celebrating miraculous healings, they focused on criticizing Jesus.

I wonder how often we as Christians become like the Pharisees. I wonder how much we lose focus on what is important and begin focusing on other things. Do we get so caught up in the things of this world, that we lose focus of the Kingdom that is not of this world? Do we get caught up in jobs, entertainment, politics, etc. and lose focus of prayer, scripture reading, serving in the church, and making disciples of Jesus Christ?

I decided to make a change to help me not be distracted by headlines on my computer. I removed them so that the distraction would no longer be there. Is there a change you need to make to stay focused on what really matters? Scripture gives us these instructions: "Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth" (Colossians 3:2) and "Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things" (Philippians 4:8). What change do you need to make to do these well?


