A Letter From the Pastor

We are rooting for the wrong things. Or at least some of us are at least some of the time. Our political divide has led us to a temptation to root against people rather than to root for what is good and loving. We are prone to root against people rather than rooting for changed hearts, for reconciled relationships, for Christ to be publicly exalted. Romans 12:21 says, "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." We become overcome by evil when we root against people because of politics or anything else that divides us. We overcome evil with good by recognizing and celebrating when people we differ from choose what is good.

Consider the response to the murder of Charlie Kirk. It is clear that Charlie was able to reach many young people with his influence. Much of what he said was focused on politics, but he also regularly proclaimed the gospel. In response to his murder, many young people have expressed a greater desire to go to church or at least pursue faith more than they had before. His influence on the lives of younger people has made them more receptive to faith in Jesus Christ. We should be rooting for this and celebrating this.

His memorial service was held recently. Throughout the service, the Gospel of Jesus Christ was proclaimed repeatedly. The name of Jesus was exalted by several political leaders. I repeat, political leaders boldly and clearly proclaimed salvation through faith in Jesus. We should be rooting for this and celebrating this.

Erika Kirk, the widow of Charlie Kirk, gave a powerful speech at her husband's memorial service. The most significant moment of the day was when she expressed her forgiveness of Charlie's murderer. What a powerful moment! What an amazing demonstration of the Gospel lived out by someone suffering such a terrible tragedy! This is the type of response that we should be rooting for and celebrating. Her response was even praised by Jimmy Kimmel, who was fresh off a suspension for his remarks on the murder of Charlie Kirk. He said she is an example to follow, noted that she is doing what Jesus teaches, and described her response as a selfless act of grace. Rather than attacking Charlie and Erika Kirk, rather than trying to find fault or even just to ignore the memorial service altogether, Jimmy Kimmel chose to praise what is good and loving and Christlike. We should be rooting for this and celebrating this.

If we are rooting for the name of Jesus to be exalted, if we are rooting for more people to hear the Gospel, if we are rooting for bold demonstrations of forgiveness, if we are rooting for peace in response to violence, then we have much to celebrate. Our political preferences or anything else should not prevent us from celebrating what is good and what promotes faith in Jesus.

We pray for the Kingdom of God to come on earth as it is in heaven, but we do not get to decide the specifics of how that happens or through whom it happens. Our job is to root for the advancement of the Kingdom of God, participate in the work of the Kingdom, and celebrate the signs of the Kingdom's advancement in our world. If signs of revival are resulting from the influence of Charlie Kirk, from politicians proclaiming the Gospel, from talk show hosts praising forgiveness, we should celebrate.
























ROADRUNNERS TRIP TUESDAY OCT. 24TH


