

Roadrunners



For our June Roadrunner's trip we will leave the church at 9:00 am on Tuesday, June 18 with our first destination the Delano Community Farmers Market, also known as the Amish Farmers Market. We will have over an hour of shopping time in the market. This is a nice little farm market located out in the countryside near Delano, Tennessee. It is owned and run by an Old Order Mennonite Community. Our last stop will be the Farm House Restaurant in Etowah, Tennessee.

We will return to the church around 2:00pm. Cost for this trip will be gas to refill the bus and our usual collection for the driver's lunch. You will be responsible for items purchased at the market and your own lunch.

The conductor will shout 'All Aboard' for or our August Roadrunner's trip as we leave the church at 8:30 am on Tuesday, August 6. We will be traveling over the mountains to Andrews, North Carolina to ride the RailBikes to enjoy the ride aboard North Carolina's First RailBike Tour for the 5-mile trip to the Historic Valley River Tunnel. Take in the views from the beautiful valley that offers you the opportunity to experience beautiful mountains, forests, and abundant wildlife. You will see crystal clear mountain rivers and streams as you cross Historic open deck railroad bridges on your trip to the tunnel. Once there you will have about 1/2 hour to check out the tunnel which was hand carved by workers from Southern Railway in 1894) and the súrrounding area. After your break, you will re-embark for the 5-mile trip back to Andrews for an opportunity to see things you missed on the trip out, so do not forget that camera! There are three riding options: 1-The RailBike is pedal motor-assisted, like e-bikes.

Each RailBike seats four people.

2-The Cart Ride holds 9 people in captain's chairs that swivel and have arm rests, with no pedaling required.

3-The Choo-Choo Speeder Ride is in a gas-powered speeder and holds 2 people, with no pedaling required. A driver will drive the Speeder for you as

you ride along.

ALL RIDES have individual seat belts for each rider. Riders must be at least 8 years old. You may bring drinks or snacks for the ride if you like. After the ride we will stop at Rib Country in nearby Murphy, NC for lunch. This small chain restaurant is known for their smoked meats and signature sauces, plus house made cobblers for dessert. After lunch we will return

to the church around 3:30pm.

Cost for this trip will be \$60.00 plus gas to refill the bus and our usual collection for the driver's lunch. You will be responsible for your own lunch. No refunds are available, but you may transfer your tickets to others if need arises. 
