Confronting Issues

This course is designed on how to confront issues. We don't fight war, like the world, we have our own God inhabitated weapons. What type of issues do we face today that relate to biblical stories, make practical solutions just like Job and the woman with an issue of blood.

ADULT CLASSES

Draw Me Closer

Instructor: Rev. Diane Cash Greater Cleggs Chapel Community Missionary Baptist Church, Timberlake

Teach the steps the methods of establishing a relationship with God, strengthening and teaching how to allow that relationship to grow. Pray, fasting, meditation, spending time with God. Reverencing Him for who he is. Worship and praise. Being in his presence. Different obstacles and hindrances to come in life that differ, or cause us to not be as active or committed to God etc., if done right, will be very effective and beneficial. Incorporate different exercises, etc.

Abundant Life/Living

Instructor: Dr. Terry Thomas Pastor, West Durham Baptist Church, Durham

This class will emphasize scripture base text of abundantly living, God's promises of being our provider and supplier of everything we need. It will also cover the responsibility of tithing, its purpose, how tithing and giving set one up for an abundant life. It will cover basic principles of saving, investing, budgeting. Breakdown and teach, what abundant living is. It's not always having everything you want, and living beyond your means and trying to hit in with the Jones, but instructing how to take one's personal financial status, life, etc and access it and see how they do not need or want for things, how God still suppliers and blesses. How to use what you got to make it abundant. One of the greatest lessons you see in the bible is how God can take what to us would be infinite, small, nothing and make it and allow it to operate and bless in abundance.

My Vision Becoming A Reality

Instructor: Rev. Dr. William C. Turner, Jr. Pastor, Mount Level Missionary Baptist Church, Durham

My Vision Becoming a Reality should expound and introduce to the class a few things: 1) We all should have a vision/goals set short and long; 2) Don't have one, get one; 3) Teacher can gather at least 3 general things one needs to have, posed in order to make their vision a reality; 4) Talk about setting goals and using a goal setting acronym; 5) What to do if you lost your vision, or it's been delayed; 6) Start off as simple as understanding what is "vision"? being able to see, sight, to look onward; 7) Things that will hinder the vision becoming a reality: hurt, disappointments, lack of effort, no determination, no support, an unreachable, unattainable goal(being realistic). A vision for his/her leadership for the church, in the church, to the church.

-Implementing goals and efforts to see how to better serve the people the flock God has given them care of.

- -Vision becoming reality. Making it happen. No excuses. No procrastination...etc.
- -examples, being able to serve more, visit the sick more, a better prayer life, a better relationship with God. Knowing the Bible more. Saving souls for Christ.
- -Going back and upholding to the requirements and qualifications of a deacon in Timothy. We can also talk about set-backs and how to deal with them.

Ministerial Ethics & Etiquette

Instructor: Dr. William Richardson

This study is designed to give helpful insights and information into the ministers both professional and private life. Also, class participants will strive to understand concepts and principles of ministerial customs, practices and decorum.
