

### **DEACON JOHNNIE PETTIFORD**


Deacon Johnny Pettiford serves as Deacon at First Ledge Rock Missionary Baptist Church. Other experiences:


Currently Pastor Isaac serves as the First Vice Moderator and Executive Board Member of the East Cedar Grove Missionary Baptist Association.





### Reaching Out Beyond the Church Walls Associate Ministers




