The Parma Police Department is now accepting applications for a Lateral Police Officer position. We at Parma Police Department embrace the team concept and are currently looking for the right individual to join our team. We are a proactive department with a goal on prevention by partnering with neighbors and community members to make our community a safer place to live, work and play.

Parma is a rural, agricultural community. The current population estimate is between 2,300 - 2,500. Our community is experiencing growth in business as well as residential and has an expectancy to gather steam with the northwestern movement through the famed Treasure Valley. With Highway 95 bisecting the middle of town, a quick 15-minute drive will have you on I-84 east towards Boise or Northwest towards the Oregon coast. Job Summary:

Parma Police Officers perform law enforcement and crime prevention to further the criminal justice process by patrolling an assigned area to observe, monitor, and enforce a wide array of ordinances, laws, and statutes. We partner with our community and neighboring Law Enforcement to provide educational, investigative, and related police services with the goal of preventing crime, ensuring public safety, and developing positive police-citizen relationships. Officers are subject to special assignments, positions, and mandatory in-service training.

Police Officers currently work a modified 10-hour shift. Shifts are subject to rotations and changes to meet the needs of the community. Police Officers are classified as Emergency Essential personnel and are subject to mandatory overtime and recall (with compensation).

Minimum Requirements:

- Must be at least 21 years of age.
- High School diploma or G.E.D. Required. Two years of secondary education preferred.
- Successful applicants must pass the Idaho POST PRT.
- POST medical/vision/hearing examination, drug test, polygraph, and a psychological evaluation upon request.
- MUST have a minimum of Idaho POST Basic Certification or Out of State Certification meeting or exceeding Idaho POST Standards.
- MUST submit DD214 (Member 4 copy) showing Honorable Discharge to receive Veteran's Preference.

Background:
