

Emergencies strike without warning and require immediate action. Whether it is a natural disaster, an infrastructure failure, a cyberattack, or another unexpected threat to your system, one of the utmost priorities is restoring drinking water and wastewater services. IdWARN is a mutual aid network connecting Idaho drinking water and wastewater utilities with resources to respond efficiently and effectively in any unpredictable situation.

How IdWARN Works

- Member agencies sign a Mutual Aid Agreement which outlines the procedures for requesting and providing aid. IdWARN membership is entirely free and voluntary.
- Members obtain access to contact information for other IdWARN members, an inventory of emergency equipment for drinking water and wastewater utilities, and training opportunities for emergency preparedness.
- Members are invited to quarterly meetings to stay up-to-date on IdWARN and build connections with nearby member utilities.
- Any emergency response is entirely voluntary by member agencies.

IdWARN Member Benefits



The benefits of a no-cost membership with IdWARN include...

- Access to emergency equipment maintained by Idaho Rural Water Association at no cost, including potable water trailers with 1,000 gallon capacity, portable generators of various outputs, sewer cameras, ground penetrating radar, line location and leak detection equipment, valve exercisers, bypass pumps, and more
- Exclusive access to drinking water and wastewater utility-specific emergency preparedness training courses to improve the resiliency of each member utility
- Immediate access to emergency contacts for utility-specific equipment, personnel, materials, or other resources
- Expedited arrival of aid based on local coordination ahead of state or federal response
- Eligibility for FEMA disaster reimbursement for federally-declared disasters
- Reduced administrative conflict, saving valuable time and resources to access aid
- Self-sufficiency to maintain operations and support other critical infrastructure during an emergency
