

## **NSA Racing Survey 2024**




Q2: How do you feel about the frequency and total number of races this past season? 17 responses




Q3: Should RC be more or less conservative with regard to weather forecast? Are you willing to race if there is a chance of higher wind and/or rain?




Q4: If weather forecast Sunday looks bad, should we continue to try to reschedule races for the preceding Saturday?




Q5: Any interest in a race during a weeknight in July, starting after 5:30pm? 17 responses




Q6: Any interest in a race day with a distance-type race, maybe into Big Pleasant Bay or just a single long race using multiple marks distributed throughout Little Bay?








Q9: Should RC delay the start of a race to square the course to the wind (i.e. resetting marks or pin)? 17 responses




Q10: Do you feel that the handcap assigned to your boat is correct relative to other handicaps in your fleet?

A qualifier to Q10: I can live with what we've had for years. But, wouldn't it be nice to see if the handicap formula presented in the Catboat Association publication gives different results? Another approach... just scrap handicaps all together.

Got to get more reaching legs into the mix. We're driving interest down to the hard core again even though I am one of them. Success on the short courses so much depends on the start and the start so much depends on knowing the rules.. We've lost roughly half of our potential participants as they almost never have time to make up a bad start. Or they get intimidated by the hard core and are reluctant to keep coming out... which ironically is the only way they will ever improve their performance. Every racing seminar/book/webinar teaches how to evaluate a starting line and short of a significant wind shift ( and yes we had a few) the delay in perfecting the line becomes another deterrent to continued participation. Finally it's not fair to require the RC to staff these races yet it's hard to find paid staff. We're not a YC with tons of members to volunteer. Plus the current format again great for the hard core just sucks in too many people, many of whom are well intentioned but inexperienced. Sorry for the "soapbox". I don't mean it to criticize the tremendous effort the RC has made at the sacrifice of their own participation.

sailing in Little Bay presents challenges but I think sponsoring 4 (ish) Sunday for a 2 races is a great way for our members to stay sharp as sailors. I do not think we need to treat the racing as a series but rather acknowledge 1-2 spots for the 2 classes each time. when you add in CYC Regatta (14s) and APBY (all boats) along with members who sail at PBCBthere is plenty of opportunity to race. Scheduling a "social sail" which could be a competitive like the Poker Run in July and then Cap'n Bill in September adds to the overall adult sailing.- thanks for asking. You ask about evening racing but most nights the wind dies around 5 so racing in Little Bay does not seem wise.

We prefer windward leeward races with no reaching marks. Keep up the good work!
