

A fine selection of winning family learning projects from our primary and secondary schools, which evidenced curiosity, scientific enquiry and a real passion for science learning. We were very proud of all the entries, presented by their creators, accompanied by their families, and hosted by secondary Science leaders..

Our secondary school welcomed the some of our Trust primary pupils for an afternoon of Science as part of Science Week. The class learnt how to light a Bunsen burner, learning about all the safety checks and setting their Bunsen Burner up in pairs. We were really pleased with their skills and following instructions. They did so well doing this that they had time to burn some chemicals, to find out what colour flame they got. They were all so confident with the Bunsen Burners by the end of the session, they will be getting their Bunsen Burner safety pass when they move up to secondary soon.

The children at Cosby have participated in various inclusive sporting events throughout the spring term. After school, children have been given the opportunity to attend an inclusive sports club. The children absolutely loved this club which focused on alternative school sports such as archery, boccia and curling. In addition to this club, the children had the opportunity to attend an inclusive sports festival which they all thoroughly enjoyed! The children who attended also won 'Spirit of the Games' for their dedication, respect and resilience during the festival. Furthermore, Year 5 students were given the opportunity to learn boxing this term! The students were focusing on their gross motor skills and developing stamina during sporting activities. The children were fully engaged with each session and were always smiling during their practice sessions.

The children were then invited to an Aspiration Active day whereby they competed in various different activities including wheelchair basketball and martial arts.







The Oaks is a unit within Thomas Estley that focuses on supporting students with Autistic Spectrum Condition (ASC) to engage with mainstream education and to develop skills that will serve them throughout their lives.

We are incredibly proud of everything our Oaks students have achieved over the past few years; including the creation and maintenance of the Oaks garden, making their own board game, and writing, producing and starring in their own highly acclaimed film "How the Grinch stole the Oaks"! Some of our Oaks students have also stepped up and taken on extra challenges by taking part in the college student leadership programmes, we have several "Reading Rangers" who work to encourage their peers to read, and our students take part in staff interview panels as well as student voice.


