2022 STAKEHOLDERS REPORT

MISSION: To provide a safe and supportive location for meetings, fellowship, educational activities, and social events for people, families, and friends in recovery.

Dear Supporters,

We are delighted to report The Meeting Place (TMP) is thriving! In addition to hosting in-person meetings, TMP provides recovery support services, a virtual home for online meetings, and facilities for anyone to access online recovery meetings. In 2022, The Meeting Place:

- Hosted 21 in-person recovery meetings each week, including Alcoholics Anonymous and other recovery fellowships. Meetings elect to make whatever donation they wish to use our space.
- Hosted the only Narcotics Anonymous meeting in the Roaring Fork Valley.
- Welcomed a SMART (Self-Management and Recovery Training) meeting, an alternative to traditional 12-Step meetings.
- Reached its sixth consecutive net positive fiscal year and reached our goal to create a reserve fund equivalent to one year of operating expenses.

This year is already off to a robust beginning, and several new initiatives have already been launched:


- Providing Free Childcare for 2 meetings each week, lowering a barrier to recovery for parents.
- Launch of Yoga for People in Recovery, a free weekly service to our recovery community.
- Licensed by the State of Colorado to participate in the Opiate Antagonist Fund, allowing us to distribute free naloxone to our community.
- Hosting a monthly High Rockies Harm Reduction Residency, which provides free fentanyl test strips, syringe exchange, sterile using equipment, harm reduction programming, overdose prevention training and peer support services. These services will be expanded in the coming months to include onsite HIV and Hepatitis testing.
- Launched a Little Free RECOVERY Library, stocked with free addiction recovery literature.
- Expanded Spanish-language resources.

The success of The Meeting Place is a true reflection of our community recognizing the gravity of addiction and the importance of recovery. Thank you for your generosity!
