PASTORAL REFLECTIONS


Ever since I was a kid, I've loved doing puzzles. Of course, as most toddlers, I started out with small puzzles with giant pieces. With age and experience, the puzzles got bigger and more challenging, the pieces got smaller and more numerous. With 500 or 1000 piece puzzles, it seemed wise to create some method of organization. I'm ready to start assembling the puzzle only after all the pieces are dumped out of the box, image side up, edge pieces separated from the rest – ready to be assembled first. I know it will take some time to get the puzzle together and it will take some patience before the whole image is complete. The fun of putting a puzzle together, for me, is the process itself and the satisfaction of seeing the final product. I have found interim ministry to be very similar.

When my work at Trinity began a few months ago, I found a congregation that loves God, their church, and one another. I also found a congregation grieving a lot of change and loss, an uncertainty about what should happen next, a sense of anxiety about how long it will take to find the next pastor, a wariness of the stranger plucked out of Idaho to lead the process. In other words, I found a puzzle with pieces that need to be put in place. Please be assured that all the thoughts and feelings you are experiencing, in my experience of being a transitional pastor, are very normal.

Using a method of organization that I have started to develop over the past several years, little by little, pieces of the puzzle have started being put together. It is taking some time to get to know staff and congregational leadership (the edge pieces). The center pieces of the puzzle are beginning to reveal a relationship with the congregation that is growing. A transition team has been created to study the needs of the congregation as it considers its future. We had a Spiritual Direction/Telling Our Story event to give a foothold for the Transition Team to begin their work. There will be more opportunities for conversation coming up. A Ministry Site Profile will be created in the next couple months and will hopefully be in the hands of potential pastoral candidates soon. A call committee will be assembled, trained and installed soon after the Transition Team is done with their work. Hopefully, before too long, there will be some pastoral candidates to interview and consider. In the end, Trinity will have its new pastor. As each piece of the puzzle is placed, the final picture will

become more defined. The process, so far, has required some strategy and patience, and in the grand scheme of things, is coming along quite nicely.

Thank you, people of Trinity, for welcoming Elvyn, Athena, and me into your community of faith – even if for only a short time. Thank you to the staff, council, and other leaders and volunteers for all the hard work you do



because you love God and God's church. I am convinced that, at the right time, your new pastor will arrive, whom you will love and will love you, as you continue to fulfill your call to be Christ's presence in the community and the world. Until then, I am honored to accompany you on the journey!

Children's Faith Formation: KidVenture

Our children continue to grow into their confident, wise, silly-selves as they lean into all the fun activities and ministry opportunities for them at Trinity. Our KidVenture class, which is on Wednesday evenings during Family Faith Night, grew from an average of 2 to an average of 9 in attendance! They are the best of friends to one another and have created a bond of trust and fun in the classroom. They welcome one another no matter the age gap and listen intently to each other's highs, lows, and God moments. We also celebrate the many other events this year for our children, including the Easter Egg Hunt, the surprise petting zoo, Trunk or Treat, Advent Festival, and even their sweet participation in Carols & Cocktails!

Trinity invited Rainbow Trail Lutheran Camp to co-host our Vacation Bible School Week this year. We added a fourth day, in addition to 3 more hours to each day! Between Pre-School and Elementary, we invited 60 kids to join us for VBS, *It's All About Grace.* This was all made possible by over 20 youth and adult volunteers. We cannot wait to partner with Rainbow Trail again in 2024.

Youth & Confirmation

After a handful of our high school students completed Confirmation in the spring, a core group initiated youth group on Wednesday evenings during Family Faith Night. The youth have shown their commitment and eagerness to build community with one another. They average five students participating on a given Wednesday night, in addition to the boys from Brad's House joining in. This year the youth have participated in service work, including making toiletry bags for people experiencing homelessness, creating care packages for our college students, and volunteering at many church events.






Youth & Confirmation (Continued)

They have also welcomed in our middle school youth on Wednesday evenings, modeling the expectations they have promised to one another in their covenant, which in turn creates a fun and engaging space in the youth room. In an effort to cultivate relationships beyond our church community, Trinity youth have made effort to join our new ecumenical city-wide youth group, *Belong Youth Collective*, or *BeYou!* BeYou! was designed to be a community of like-minded faith across different church denominations. Their first gathering was in February, and they meet every 3rd Sunday of the month at a church in Colorado Springs.

Four students participated in our first youth trip in a few years to Moab, UT. They camped in the spacious red rocks of Eastern Utah, explored national parks, took a boat tour on the Colorado River, and reflected on what it meant to abide in God's beautiful creation! This year they anticipate a trip to New Orleans, LA where they will gather with thousands of other youth in the ELCA.

This year Trinity had four students affirm their baptism in May after creating their own unique faith statements. They participated in a faith statement writing retreat and celebrated a few years of diving into the academic side of their faith along with the continuous personal reflection of their beliefs. This year, four new students are participating in confirmation, co-led by Pastor Mary and Sam. They meet twice a month on Sundays after worship.



Young Adults: Gather Pikes Peak

Our ecumenical young adult group, Gather Pikes Peak, will celebrate two years of ministry in January. They have seen their ministry grow as they welcome in partners from the Episcopal, Methodist, United Church of Christ, and Lutheran churches in the Colorado Springs area. This summer, they received a grant from the national office of ELCA Young Adults to support the costs of hospitality and fellowship supplies, along with guest speakers and leaders.

This fall, they started a new series called Theology on Tap, where faith leaders in the community facilitate conversations on faith topics they're passionate about. The second gathering of the month follows up on that topic over a meal, act of service, worship, or an engaging activity.

TRANSITION TEAM

The transition team is formed with two goals. ONE: to discover a new and deepened sense of identity and purpose for the congregation and TWO: to establish a healthy relationship with

the next rostered minister. The transition team does this by engaging in the self-study process – intentionally looking at who the congregation has been, who the community is now, and who God is calling the community to be in the future. The self-study creates a roadmap for the congregation and the Call Committee, acknowledging all aspects of the congregation's identity for the sake of the future.

COMMUNICATIONS TEAM

The communications team was created to start "behind the scenes" work to make Trinity communications more streamlined and uniform. Most of what we worked on you probably did not notice, but for a new visitor, it makes all the information look consistent from colors, fonts, logos, etc. The areas we worked on were the website, the weekly e-newsletter called Constant Contact, the screens during worship, a new bumper sticker, and more.

WORSHIP & MUSIC MINISTRY TEAM

In 2023, the Worship and Music Ministry team prioritized a list of desired improvements to the sound system. Using mostly designated funds, equipment was purchased to provide personal monitors for the worship band and singers. These personal monitors make it easier for the members of the team to hear themselves and each other in the mix. A hands-free microphone was also procured for the use of the worship assistant and the lector. Wiring challenges have delayed the installation of this mic, but we hope to install it soon.

The team has refined the list of future improvements and we are getting pricing for each item. Once the details are worked out, funding will be pursued, in the form of a grant or special offering, or both. Improvements being pursued are the addition of ambient mics, to add the sound of the congregation singing and responding to the livestream, an improved antenna management system for the wireless mics, and projector maintenance.

The Worship and Music Ministry team consists of representatives of the entire church, including council, staff, and the congregation. Comments and suggestions are encouraged. See Don Simpson, who is the council member who is facilitating this team.





TRINITY COMMUNITY PARK TEAM

This is the largest missional project Trinity has ever done for Monument and the greater community. Everyday there are families on our property laughing, having fun, and playing. Trinity's motto is "Touched by the Hand of God to Touch the Lives of Others." We seek to reach out into our community to help **EVERYONE**, especially those who are underserved or made to feel like outsiders.

A small core group of volunteers are writing grants, making presentations, and seeking funding to complete this park. There are many grants denied for every grant awarded, many companies step-up, but even more decline. It is hard work, but we are making a difference. In September we built Phase 2 with over 70 community volunteers; it was absolutely heartwarming to see people come together for our community and this project. Next time you see a family at the park, make a connection. It will warm your heart.

2024 projects will include a large steel shade structure between Phase 1 and Phase 2 with a concrete pad and tables along with benches around the park. Accessible parking striping, concrete pathway from parking lot, trail maintenance, signage, and landscaping. We are touching lives for **EVERYONE**!

TCP is not just a playground for kids. It's not just the first ADA park in Monument. We are a playground for **EVERYONE** at every stage of life.

INCLUSION & RECONCILIATION TEAM

In our second year, The Inclusion and Reconciliation Team has been digging in deeper and deeper into what it means for us as disciples of Christ to truly love, welcome and include all of God's children. We continue to meet bi-monthly at someone's home for fellowship and discussion. What we've learned, our conversations and our reflections have yielded some recommendations that have now been put into practice at Trinity. This year, we introduced a land acknowledgment statement which has been adopted by Trinity, professed in worship, and appears in much of our media - including this document - check it out! Members of the IRT write Prayers of the People for the 4th Sunday of every month to coincide with monthly heritage and awareness designations. And we have proposed a Welcome Statement specifying the importance of intentionally naming people who have been marginalized, minoritized, or excluded from communities of faith. This fall we facilitated a Bible Study during Family Faith Night focused on the scriptural passages that have and are being used to exclude LGBTQ+ individuals and communities from the church.

For 2024, we plan to continue our journey of Building an Inclusive Church. Our next step invites all into conversation about what this means and what members of Trinity are thinking and feeling about this path. Trinity's Reconciling Scripture Bible Study is also available for any other study group that would choose this focus for 6-8 weeks. FACILITIES TEAM

This year, the congregation once again stepped in to keep our facilities running smoothly. All have gone above and beyond in willingness to tidy and improve our building. We thank all who came to the annual spring-cleaning day, and those who complete the day-to-day cleaning tasks, mowing, raking, and shoveling. Because of our volunteers, our building and property is safe and welcoming!

Facility highlights include two broken windows repaired, multiple furnaces bandaged up, parking lot lights repaired, new thermostats, and bushes removed from the traffic circle near the park for a safer playing experience. Additionally, a group of techies, with the help of our outsourced IT company, reconfigured the building's outdated Wi-Fi system, allowing faster, safer, and organized Wi-Fi use for staff, guests, and livestream.

Upcoming expenses and projects include clerestory windows leak repair, furnace upkeep, and installing LED lights in the parking lot. Please continue to pray our facilities remain in working conditions another year!

FINANCE TEAM

The Finance Committee has undergone some transitions of our own this past year. After faithfully serving for several years as our Finance Manager, Brian Creelman passed the torch to Delaney Evelo, who was then called away when husband Joe was reassigned to Ohio. Kevin Engelhardt has graciously stepped in to fill the gap until we can find a permanent replacement. Please contact the church office if you or someone you know may be interested in this part time paid position (~8hrs/week).

The year started with a forecasted \$23K deficit but expenses were reduced during our time without a full-time pastor. Just as important, many members graciously donated their time and talents to help backfill the needs for office administrator, media, facility maintenance, cleaning, and much more. Because of your contributions of time, talents, and resources, we were able to end the year with a budget surplus!

The Finance Committee would like to offer our sincere thanks for your continued generosity and willingness to engage and expand the ministry of Trinity. God provides through all of us!
